

REGULAR MEETING

January 16, 1962

THE COMMON COUNCIL of the City of Bloomington, Indiana, met in the Council Chambers in City Hall, on Tuesday, January 16, 1962, at the hour of seven-thirty o' clock (7:30 P.M.) in regular session with Mayor Lemon presiding.

Members present: Sikes, Chitwood, Peace, Graves, Faucett, Hickman and Shertzer.

Councilman Peace moved, seconded by Councilman Shertzer that the minutes of the last regular meeting be approved as submitted to each individual councilman; motion unanimously carried.

Councilman Sikes moved, seconded by Councilman Chitwood, that Ordinance No. 3, 1962 be advanced to second reading by title only. On roll call vote; motion unanimously carried.

After reading by title only, Councilman Peace moved, seconded by Councilman Hickman that Ordinance No. 3, 1962 be duly adopted. On roll call vote Ordinance No. 3, 1962 was unanimously adopted.

Councilman Sikes presented Ordinance No. 4, 1962 for first reading by the Clerk-Treasurer.

After discussion of renaming Woodscrest Street, the Mayor recommended that further investigation be made by the Public Works Committee and report be made at next meeting.

Councilman Graves moved, seconded by Councilman Hickman, that the street light as petitioned in the 400 block of South Lincoln be approved and installed under the supervision of the City Engineer; motion unanimously carried.


Reports were received from the Street Department, Sanitation Department, Sanitarian Officer, Milk Sanitarian, Rosehill Cemetery, Engineer Department, and the Police Department for the month of December 1961 and placed on file.

Mayor Lemon reported to the council that Mr. Cooney, City Engineer, had sent out letter to various organizations and firms regarding the building code and was receiving good response relating to this information.


Mayor Lemon recommended to the Common Council that the Ordinance Committee study the feasibility of licensing cab drivers and metering taxi cabs.

Mayor Lemon also reported to the Council that the Board of Public Works and Safety had approved a new rule that all applications for connections to City water and sewer utilities outside the city limits be required to obtain a plumbing permit as is required inside city limits. He also informed the Council that the Police Department had erected a three-way stop sign at 4th. and Washington Streets on a 90-day emergency basis.

Councilman Chitwood moved, seconded by Councilman Graves, that the claims presented for payment January 17, 1962 be approved as submitted; motion unanimously carried.
