

REGULAR MEETING

February 6, 1962

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA, met in the Council Chambers in City Hall, on Tuesday, February 6, 1962, at the hour of seven-thirty o'clock (7:30 P.M.) in regular session with Mayor Thos. L. Lemon presiding.

Members present: Sikes, Chitwood, Peace, Graves, Faucett, Hickman, and Shertzer.

Members absent: None.

The meeting was opened with a prayer by Councilman Graves.

Councilman Peace moved, seconded by Councilman Faucett that the minutes of the last regular meeting of January 16, 1962 be approved as submitted to each individual councilman; motion unanimously carried.

Councilman Sikes presented Ordinance No. 4, 1962 for second reading by the Clerk-Treasurer. After second reading and public hearing, Councilman Hickman moved, seconded by Councilman Graves that Ordinance No. 4, 1962 be duly adopted. Upon a roll call vote Ordinance No. 4, 1962 was unanimously adopted.

Councilman Sikes presented Ordinance No. 5, 1962 for first reading by the Clerk-Treasurer.

Mayor Lemon reported that there was some disagreement among the residents at First Street and Rose over the location of a street light that had previously been approved by the Common Council and requested the Committee to reinvestigate this installation and make a recommendation to the Public Service Company as to where it should be installed. Mrs. Mead, a property owner, on the northeast corner of the intersection gave permission for the street light to be installed at that corner thereby solving the question.

Councilman Graves recommended and requested that the City Attorney obtain a copy of the Dog Ordinance now in effect in Indianapolis for study and comparison to the Dog Ordinance that is now in effect in Bloomington.

Mayor Lemon presented the following letter from the Housing Authority of the City of Bloomington to be recorded into the minutes:

January 30, 1962

The Common Council of the City of Bloomington, Indiana City Hall Bloomington, Indiana

Gentlemen:

The Housing Authority of the City of Bloomington, Indiana is developing a housing project at Bloomington, Indiana pursuant to approvals already given by the Common Council of the City of Bloomington. These approvals were contained in a Resolution dated April 4, 1961 and a Cooperation Agreement dated May 2, 1961.

Section 402 of the Housing Act of 1954 (PL-560, 83rd Congress), amending the Housing Act of 1937, as amended, provides that prior to the execution of an Annual Contributions Contract the Local Authority shall notify the governing body of the locality of its estimate of the annual amount of payments in lieu of taxes which will be made for the project and of the amount of taxes which would be levied if the property were privately owned.

We wish to advise you that our estimate of the annual amount of payments in lieu of taxes is \$4,392.00 and of the annual amount of taxes which would be levied were the property privately owned is \$83,113.00.

The property owners are James and Ann Moore, Robert A. and Beatrice E. Cooper and Gladys L. Woodward.

Department reports were received for the month of January, 1962, from the Sanitation Department, Street Department, Sanitarian Officer, Humane Officer, Milk Sanitarian, Fire Department, and Engineering Department and placed on file.

The Clerk-Treasurer presented annual financial reports for the City of Bloomington, Water Department, and Sanitation Department.

Councilman Chitwood moved, seconded by Councilman Faucett that the claims presented for payment February 7, 1962 be approved as submitted; motion unanimously carried.
