

March 6, 1962

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA, met in the Council Chambers in City Hall, on Tuesday, March 6, 1962, at the hour of seven-thirty o'clock (7:30 P.M.) in regular session with Councilman Sikes presiding in the absence of the Mayor.

Members present: Sikes, Peace, Faucett, and Shertzer.

Members absent: Chitwood, Graves, and Hickman.

The meeting was opened by the Clerk-Treasurer who asked for nominations for presiding officer. Councilman Peace moved, seconded by Councilman Faucett that Councilman Sikes be nominated as presiding officer; motion unanimously carried.

Councilman Peace moved, seconded by Councilman Faucett that the minutes of the last regular meeting of February 20, 1962 be approved as submitted to each individual councilman; motion unanimously carried.

Councilman Peace moved, seconded by Councilman Faucett that Ordinance No. 6, 1962 pertinent to rezoning of certain properties located on the south side of Second Street west of Rogers Street, be advanced to second reading by title only. Upon a roll call vote the motion was unanimously carried. After second reading by title only by the Clerk-Treasurer and a public hearing on Ordinance No. 6, 1962, Councilman Peace moved, seconded by Councilman Shertzer that Ordinance No. 6, 1962 be duly adopted. Upon a roll call vote Ordinance No. 6, 1962 was unanimously adopted.

Councilman Peace presented Ordinance No. 7, 1962 for first reading by the Clerk-Treasurer.

The following reports were received for the month of February, 1962: Street Dept., Milk Sanitarian, Humane Officer, Sanitarian Officer, Water Dept., Sanitation Dept., Fire Dept. and Engineering Dept.; The annual report of 1962 was received from the Fire Dept.

Councilman Peace read the following Public Safety Committee report:

Regarding action of Traffic Commission.

1. Remove parking on West Davis St. from Rogers to the first alley west. Establish two-hour time limit parking from this alley to the deadend west. (app. one-half block.)
2. Establish and mark by suitable pavement lines a ten foot wide east bound traffic lane on the southside of the 200 block of W. 11th. St. This lane to begin at least one-hundred feet west of College. Establish traffic obedience line at least eight feet west of crosswalk.
3. The Traffic Commission requests action by the Council in the form of a resolution to the State Highway Department regarding a driving visibility hazard on the south side of W. 2nd. St. at Madison. At the last meeting the Commission approved the removal of parking and yellow curb painting for a distance of 44 feet west and for a distance of 22 feet east of this intersection. W. 2nd St. is the route of St. Highway 45.

The Public Safety Committee has studied and investigated these requests and hereby ask the Common Council to amend the schedule of the Traffic Ordinance to include these changes.
