

REGULAR MEETING

June 19, 1962

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA, met in the Council Chambers in City Hall, on Tuesday, June 19, 1962, at the hour of seven-thirty o'clock (7:30 P.M.) in regular session with Mayor Mary Alice Dunlap presiding.

Members present: Sikes, Chitwood, Peace, Faucett, and Hickman.

Members absent: Graves and Shertzer.

Councilman Peace moved, seconded by Councilman Hickman that the minutes of the last regular meeting of June 5, 1962 be approved as submitted to each individual councilman; motion unanimously carried.

Councilman Sikes moved, seconded by Councilman Peace that Ordinance No. 12, 1962 be advanced to second reading and read by title only. Upon a roll call vote the motion was unanimously carried. After second reading by title only by the Clerk-Treasurer, Councilman Peace moved, seconded by Councilman Hickman that Ordinance No. 12, 1962, pertinent to amending Section 8-6 of the Building Code of the City of Bloomington, be duly adopted. Upon a roll call vote Ordinance No. 12, 1962 was unanimously adopted.

Councilman Sikes moved, seconded by Councilman Chitwood that Appropriation Ordinance No. 1, 1962 be advanced to second reading and read by title only. Upon a roll call vote the motion was unanimously carried. After second reading by title only by the Clerk-Treasurer, Councilman Peace moved, seconded by Councilman Hickman that Appropriation Ordinance No. 1, 1962 be duly adopted. Upon a roll call vote Appropriation Ordinance No. 1, 1962 was unanimously adopted.

Councilman Sikes presented Ordinance Nos. 13, 14, 15, and 16, 1962 for first reading by the Clerk-Treasurer.

Councilman Sikes moved, seconded by Councilman Faucett that Ordinance No. 16, 1962 be advanced to second reading by title only. Upon a roll call vote the motion was unanimously carried. After second reading by title only by the Clerk-Treasurer, Councilman Hickman moved, seconded by Councilman Chitwood that Ordinance No. 16, 1962, pertinent to the annexation of adjacent and contiguous territory, be duly adopted. Upon a roll call vote Ordinance No. 16, 1962 was unanimously adopted.

Councilman Sikes presented Ordinance Nos. 17 and 18, 1962 for first reading by the Clerk-Treasurer.

Mr. Delbert C. Miller, Blue Ridge Drive, appeared requesting that action be taken on the hazardous traffic situation at the intersection of Eighth Street and Indiana Avenue. Councilman Hickman moved, seconded by Councilman Peace that the Traffic Commission take up the matter of the hazardous traffic situation at the intersection of East Eighth Street and Indiana Avenue for study and action and present a report at the first Council meeting following the next Traffic Commission meeting; motion unanimously carried.

Councilman Peace moved, seconded by Councilman Hickman that the Council present a request to the Indiana State Highway Commission that the speed limit of 30 miles per hour on State Highway 46 East be extended east to the City Limits at Smith Road; motion unanimously carried.

Councilman Hickman reported on the improvement of traffic in his area following the 20 miles per hour speed limit imposed by the Council on June 5, 1962 and the installation of 20 miles per hour signs.

Councilman Hickman moved, seconded by Councilman Peace that a recommendation to lower the speed limit to 20 miles per hour on First Street from High Street to Mitchell Street, on Mitchell Street from Maxwell Lane to Third Street, and on Woodlawn from Maxwell Lane south to the City Limits be referred to the Traffic Commission for its approval; motion unanimously carried.

Councilman Chitwood reported on the Metropolitan School Board vacancy created by the resignation, effective August 1, 1962, of Mr. Frank Southern. Councilman Chitwood moved, seconded by Councilman Hickman that Mr. Hurshel McCutchen be elected to the Metropolitan School Board effective August 1, 1962; motion unanimously carried.

The Council commended Mr. Southern for his twenty one years of service and devotion to the schools of our community.

Reports for the month of May, 1962, were received and placed on file from the Water Department, Fire Department, Police Department, Humane Officer, Sanitarian Officer and Milk Sanitarian.

Councilman Chitwood moved, seconded by Councilman Faucett that the claims presented for payment June 20, 1962 be allowed as submitted; motion unanimously carried.

Meeting adjourned.
