July 17, 1962

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA, met in the Council Chambers in City Hall, on Tuesday, July 17, 1962, at the hour of seven thirty o'clock (7:30 P. M.) in regular session with Mayor Mary Alice Dunlap presiding.

Members present: Sikes, Chitwood, Peace, Graves and Hickman

Members absent: Faucett and Shertzer

The meeting was opened with a prayer by Councilman Graves.

Councilman Peace moved, seconded by Councilman Graves that the minutes of the regular meeting of July 3, 1962 be approved as submitted to each individual Councilman; motion unanimously carried.

Councilman Sikes moved, seconded by Councilman Chitwood that Ordinance No. 19, 1962 be advanced to second reading and read by title only. Upon a roll call vote, the motion was unanimously carried. After second reading by title only by the Clerk-Treasurer, Councilman Peace moved, seconded by Councilman Hickman that Ordinance No. 19, 1962 pertinent to the providing for safety of pedestrians where sidewalks are obstructed or blocked during razing, remodeling, or construction of buildings be dully adopted. Upon a roll call vote, Ordinance No. 19, 1962 was unanimously adopted.

Councilman Sikes presented Ordinances No. 20, 1962 for second reading by the Clerk-Treasurer. After reading, Councilman Graves moved, seconded by Councilman Hickman that Ordinance No. 20 pertaining to ammending Chapter 18 of the Municipal Code of Bloomington, Indiana, 1957, be dully adopted. Upon a roll call vote, Ordinance No. 20 was unanimously adopted.

Councilman Sikes presented Ordinances No. 21 and 22, 1962 for first reading by the Clerk-Treasurer.

Councilman Graves read requests for street lighting at 700 West Dixie St. (by Mrs. Chambers) and at 3101 Kingsley Drive. Councilman Graves moved, seconded by Councilman Hickman that these requests be referred to the Street Lighting Committee of the Common Council, and that they be studied as to their relation to a future over- all lighting project.

Councilman Peace informed the Council that the Complete Traffic Commission Report would be given at the next regular Council meeting.

Councilman Chitwood presented a plaque to Mr. Frank Southern in recognition of his 21 years of outstanding service on the Metropolitan School Board.

Councilman Chitwood moved, seconded by Councilman Graves that the claims submitted for payment for July 18, 1962 be allowed as presented. Motion was unanimously carried.

Reports for the month of June 1962 were received and placed on file from the Engineer's Department, Fire Department, Sanitation Officer, Milk Sanitarian, Humane Officer and Water Department.
