

REGULAR MEETING

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA, met in the Council Chambers in City Hall on Tuesday, September 18, 1962 at the hour of seven thirty (7:30 p.m.) in regular session with Mayor Mary Alice Dunlap presiding.

Members present: Sikes, Chitwood, Peace, Graves, Faucett, Hickman and Shertzer.

The meeting was opened with a prayer by Councilman Graves.

Councilman Peace moved, seconded by Councilman Hickman that the minutes of the regular meeting on September 4, 1962 be approved as submitted to each individual Councilman; motion unanimously carried.

Councilman Peace read the following report from the Bloomington Traffic Commission:

BLOOMINGTON TRAFFIC COMMISSION

To: The Mayor and the Common Council of Bloomington, Indiana

At the September 11, 1962 meeting of the Bloomington Traffic Commission, below listed traffic and related recommendations were adopted and are herewith submitted to the Mayor and the Common Council for consideration and action:

1. Recommends that a 15-minute parking space be designated on the East side of College Avenue, just north of Smith Avenue and that the yellow marking on the corner be extended one car length, to the north.
2. Recommends that 2-hour parking be designated on Rogers Street, south of Fourth Street on the east side in front of business establishments located in the area.
3. RECOMMENDS that the north-west alley, just north of the RCA plant be made 1-way west from Rogers Street to Fairview.

It was noted by Mayor Dunlap that item three should have read east-west alley.

Councilman Peace moved, seconded by Councilman Graves that items number one and three of the Bloomington Traffic Commission report be adopted as recommended by the committee and that the traffic schedule of the traffic ordinance be amended accordingly.

Following discussion an amendment was proposed to the motion and Councilman Peace moved, seconded by Councilman Graves that under the amended motion only item number three of the Traffic Commission report be adopted and that items number one and two be held for further investigation; motion unanimously carried.

Councilman Faucett moved, seconded by Councilman Hickman that the request for the establishment of a 4-way stop, instead of the present 2-way stop, at 5th and Madison be turned over to the Traffic Commission for investigation; motion unanimously carried.

Reports for the month of September were received from the Humane Officer, Water Department, Engineering Department, Milk Sanitarian, and Sanitarian Officer, and placed on file in the Clerk-Treasurer's Office.

Councilman Chitwood moved, seconded by Councilman Faucett that the claims presented for payment on September 19, 1962 be allowed as submitted; motion unanimously carried.

Meeting adjourned.
