

REGULAR MEETING

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA, met in the Council Chambers in City Hall at the hour of seven-thirty (7:30 P.M.) on Tuesday, December 18, 1962 in regular session with Mayor Mary Alice Dunlap presiding.

Members present: Sikes, Chitwood, Peace, Faucett, Hickman, and Shertzer.

Members absent: Graves.

Councilman Peace moved, seconded by Councilman Hickman, that the minutes of the last regular meeting of December 4, 1962 be approved as submitted to each individual Councilman; motion unanimously carried.

Councilman Sikes presented Resolutions Number 11 and 12 for reading by the Clerk-Treasurer. The Clerk-Treasurer read Resolutions Number 11.

Councilman Sikes moved, seconded by Councilman Peace, that Resolution Number 11, pertaining to correcting the City's application for Federal assistance in building a proposed incinerator, be approved. Upon a roll call vote the motion was unanimously carried.

The Clerk-Treasurer read Resolution Number 12.

Councilman Peace moved, seconded by Councilman Hickman, that Resolution Number 12, pertaining to various transfers in the accounts of the Park and Recreation Department be approved. Upon a roll call vote the motion was unanimously carried. (Resolutions Number 11 and 12 were filed in the office of the Clerk-Treasurer).

The Clerk-Treasurer read Plan Commission Resolution Number 10.

Councilman Sikes moved, seconded by Councilman Chitwood, that Plan Commission Resolution Number 10, pertaining to the renaming of Spring Street between 8th and 9th Streets, be referred to the Public Works Committee of the Council for study and report; motion unanimously carried.

The Mayor reported to the Council on the excellent performance of the new garbage contractor.

The Mayor thanked the Councilman for their interest and work during 1962 and stated that she was looking forward to a progressive year ahead.

The following reports were received for the month of November and placed on file in the Clerk-Treasurer's Office: Urban Redevelopment Newsletter, Sanitarian Officer, Humane Officer, and Water Department.

Councilman Chitwood moved, seconded by Councilman Faucett, that the claims presented for payment December 19, 1962 be allowed as submitted; motion unanimously carried.
