

REGULAR MEETING

January 3, 1961

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA, met in the Council Chambers in City Hall, on Tuesday, January 3, 1961, at the hour of six-thirty o'clock (6:30 P.M. C.S.T.) in regular session with Mayor Thos. L. Lemon presiding.

Members present: Sikes, Peace, Graves, Chitwood, Faucett, Hickman, and Shertzer.

Members absent: None.

The meeting was opened with a prayer by Councilman Graves.

Councilman Graves moved, seconded by Councilman Peace that the minutes of the last regular meeting of December 20, 1960 be approved as submitted to each individual councilman; motion unanimously carried.

Councilman Sikes moved, seconded by Councilman Chitwood that Ordinance No. 1, 1961 be advanced to second reading by title only. Roll call vote the motion was unanimously carried. After second reading by title only by the Clerk-Treasurer, Councilman Peace moved, seconded by Councilman Sikes that Ordinance No. 1, 1961 be duly adopted. Upon a roll call vote Ordinance No. 1, 1961 was unanimously adopted.

Councilman Sikes presented Ordinance No. 2, 1961 for second reading by the Clerk-Treasurer. After second reading by the Clerk-Treasurer, Councilman Graves moved, seconded by Councilman Hickman that Ordinance No. 2, 1961 be duly adopted. Upon a roll call vote Ordinance No. 2, 1961 was unanimously adopted.

Councilman Sikes moved, seconded by Councilman Chitwood that the rules of the Common Council be suspended to permit the introduction of Ordinances No. 3 and 4, 1961; motion unanimously carried.

Councilman Sikes presented Ordinance No. 3, 1961 for first reading by the Clerk-Treasurer. Councilman Sikes moved, seconded by Councilman Chitwood that Ordinance No. 3, 1961 be advanced to second reading by title only. Roll call vote the motion was unanimously carried. After second reading by title only by the Clerk-Treasurer, Councilman Hickman moved, seconded by Councilman Faucett that Ordinance No. 3, 1961 be duly adopted. Upon a roll call vote Ordinance No. 3, 1961 was unanimously adopted.

Councilman Sikes presented Ordinance No. 4, 1961 for first reading by the Clerk-Treasurer. Councilman Sikes moved, seconded by Councilman Chitwood that Ordinance No. 4, 1961 be advanced to second reading by title only. Roll call vote the motion was unanimously carried. After second reading by title only by the Clerk-Treasurer, Councilman Peace moved, seconded by Councilman Graves that Ordinance No. 4, 1961 be duly adopted. Upon a roll call vote Ordinance No. 4, 1961 was unanimously adopted.

The Clerk-Treasurer read a petition from Robert Fee requesting the readjusting of street light locations in the area bounded by Mitchell Street on the west-east on High Street and from Maxwell Lane to Third Street. Councilman Graves moved, seconded by Councilman Hickman that this petition be referred to the City Engineer for investigation and report back to next Council meeting; motion unanimously carried.

Councilman Peace read the following recommendation from the Public Safety Committee and moved its adoption; motion unanimously carried:

Committee on Public Safety. Jan. 3, 1961
Report to Common Council.

At the last meeting of the Council, held on Dec. 20, a request from Capt. Fox of the Traffic Division was referred to this committee for study.

As a result of this study the committee makes the following report and recommendation:

"In the interest of public safety all parking be removed from both sides of South Rogers Street from Fourth Street to Fifth Street and that the Traffic schedule of the Traffic ordinance be amended accordingly."
