Proposed - General Business Meeting, Bloomington Jaycees, February 8, 1961 Whereas,

The Jaycees are interested in programs designed to elevate the standard of living in our community,

and whereas, we believe that the vigor of community citizenry is adversely affected by surrendering the financial responsibility for such programs to outside agencies, and that problems of a local nature are handled most economically by local funds;

therefore, be it resolved; that the Maycees be on record that when the present analysis is completed the report be studied with the view in mind that problems be solved by local citizens on an urban renewal commission enlisting the support of organizations and individuals interested in investment opportunities.

Assured by the attorney of the petitioner and officials of the Indiana Gas & Water Co. that all rights of easement will be maintained, this Committee asks the Council to notify the City Attorney not to oppose suit to vacate said alley.
