

## REGULAR MEETING

December 6, 1960

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA, met in the Council Chambers in City Hall, on Tuesday, December 6, 1960, at the hour of six-thirty o'clock (6:30 P.M. C.S.T.) in regular session with Mayor Thos. L. Lemon presiding.

Members present: Sikes, Peace, Graves, Chitwood, Faucett, Hickman, and Shertzer.

Members absent: None.

The meeting was opened with a prayer by Councilman Graves.

Councilman Peace moved, seconded by Councilman Hickman that the minutes of the last regular meeting of November 15, 1960 be approved as submitted to each individual councilman; motion unanimously carried.

Mayor Lemon welcomed Assistant Professor John Meers of the Department of Police Administration at Indiana University and police officials from Greece who are guests on the Campus.

Councilman Sikes presented an amendment to Appropriation Ordinance No. 3, 1960, as follows:

December 5, 1960

To thye City Councilmen:

The State law provides that after the tax rates and levies have been finally fixed, the appropriating body of each municipal corporation shall allocate the funds to be derived from the levy in such a manner that the expenditures will not exceed the funds to be received. I have now received the certification from the County Auditor as to the Civil City tax levy for 1961, namely, \$2.48, which necessitates reduction in the budgets for 1961, as follows:

The respective Boards recommended that these reductions be made in the specific items as follows:

I recommend the Council amend the Budget as adopted for 1961 to make the reductions as suggested above.

Councilman Sikes moved, seconded by Councilman Chitwood that Appropriation Ordinance No. 3, 1960 be amended as recommended by the Clerk-Treasurer; motion unanimously carried.

Mr. James Register, Attorney, orally petitioned the City of Bloomington to execute a new deed containing a correct description of 1.25 acres of land located in Section 34, Township 10 North, Range 1 East, in Monroe County, Indiana, purporting to correct a former deed made by the City of Bloomington to Gertie McClung, and her now deceased husband, Lewis McClung, July 8, 1957, which was recorded in the Office of the Recorder of the County of Monroe, Deed Record No. 124, page #251.

Councilman Sikes moved, seconded by Councilman Chitwood that this oral petition as presented by Mr. Register be referred to the Building and Properties Committee of the Common Council and the City Engineer for study and investigation and report be made at the next Council meeting; motion unanimously carried.

Councilman Peace read the following Traffic Commission report:

BLOOMINGTON TRAFFIC COMMISSION

TO: The Mayor and the Common Council of Bloomington, Indiana

At the November 22, 1960 meeting of the Bloomington Traffic Commission, the below listed traffic recommendation was adopted and is herewith submitted to the Mayor and the Common Council for consideration and action:

- 1. Recommends that the 90-day emergency 2-hr. time limit set in the 100 block of north Grant street be written into the traffic ordinance as a permanent order at the expiration of the 90-day trial period.

Councilman Graves moved, seconded by Councilman Peace that the petition for a street light at the corner of Fairview and West First Streets be approved; motion unanimously carried.

Reports were received and placed on file for the month of November, 1960, from Rosehill Cemetery, Fire Dept., Plumbing Inspector, Milk Inspector, Sanitarian Officer, Humane Officer, Water Dept., Street Dept., and Sanitation Dept.

Councilman Chitwood moved, seconded by Councilman Faucett that the claims presented for payment December 7, 1960, be allowed as submitted; motion unanimously carried.
