

REGULAR MEETING

June 2, 1959

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA, met in the Council Chambers in City Hall, on Tuesday, June 2, 1959, at the hour of Seven-thirty o'clock (7:30 P.M. D.S.T.) in regular session with Mayor Thos. L. Lemon presiding.

Members present: Graves, Chitwood, Griffith, Sikes, Miller, Peace, and Van Meter.

Members absent: None.

The meeting was opened with a prayer by Reverend Richard Hittle of the Clear Creek Christian Church.

Councilman Graves moved, seconded by Councilman Chitwood that the minutes be approved of the last regular meeting, May 19, 1959, as submitted to each individual councilman; motion unanimously carried.

Councilman Sikes presented Ordinance No. 9, 1959 for second reading. Councilman Griffith moved, seconded by Councilman Chitwood that Ordinance No. 9, 1959 be advanced to second reading by title only; motion unanimously carried. After second reading by title only by the Clerk-Treasurer, Councilman Chitwood moved, seconded by Councilman Griffith that Ordinance No. 9, 1959 be duly adopted. Upon a roll call vote Ordinance No. 9, 1959 was unanimously adopted.

Councilman Sikes presented Ordinance No. 10, 1959 for first reading by the Clerk-Treasurer. Councilman Griffith moved, seconded by Councilman Peace that Ordinance No. 10, 1959 be advanced to second reading by title only; motion unanimously carried. After second reading by title only by the Clerk-Treasurer, Councilman Miller moved, seconded by Councilman Chitwood that Ordinance No. 10, 1959 be duly adopted. Upon a roll call vote Ordinance No. 10, 1959 was duly adopted with Councilman Sikes not voting.

James Kent, Attorney for Mr. & Mrs. Eugene Bender and Mr. & Mrs. Henry Gray petitioned the Common Council to not oppose a suit in Circuit Court for vacating the alley in the following described real estate:

A part of Seminary Lot #91, lying between platted sub-divisions lots #15 of WM. Alexanders Addition and Lot #21 of College Place Addition to the City of Bloomington, Indiana, and lying entirely within Section 4, Township 8 North, Range 1 West of 2nd principal meridian, bounded and described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at a point on the West boundary of Seminary Lot #91 at the South line of Hunter Avenue, also being described as being the Northeast corner of W. Alexanders Addition Lot #15, thence running South along and with the West Boundary of Seminary Lot #91 (also being the East boundary of Alexander Addition Lot #15) a distance of 137.5 feet, thence East 7.5 feet and to the West Boundary line of College Place Addition and the Southwest corner of College Place Addition Lot #21, thence running North along and with the West Boundary of College Place Addition and College Place Addition Lot #21 a distance of 137.5 feet to the South line of Hunter Avenue, also being the Northwest corner of College Place Addition Lot #21, thence running West along and with the South Boundary line of Hunter Avenue a distance of 7.5 feet and to the point of beginning.

Councilman Chitwood moved, seconded by Councilman Griffith that the City Attorney be instructed not to oppose a suit in Circuit Court as petitioned by Mr. Kent in behalf of Mr. & Mrs. Eugene Bender and Mr. & Mrs. Henry Gray; motion unanimously carried.

Mr. Henry Andrews discussed informally with the Council matters pertinent to the new cemetery on East Third Street and expressed his desire to work with the Committee in setting up the rules and regulations for this cemetery.

Councilman Griffith requested the City Engineer to investigate and varify the street names on West Ninth Street in the vicinity of the West Ninth Street Park.

Petitions for street lights were received for the following locations:

- 1. Corner of Monroe and West Cottage Grove.
- 2. At the alley at the beginning of the 1000 block of West Cottage Grove.
- 3. At the corner of West Fifteenth and Lindbergh Drive.

The City Utilities Committee moved that these street lights be approved for installation; motion unanimously carried.

Monthly reports were received from the Fire Department and the Plumbing Inspector for the month of May, 1959 and placed on file.


Message from Mayor:

- 3. Loitering around the taverns and streets in the City of Bloomington.


Councilman Chitwood moved, seconded by Councilman Van Meter that the claims be allowed as submitted for payment June 3, 1959; motion unanimously carried.
