

REGULAR MEETING

November 3, 1959

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA, met in the Council Chambers in City Hall, on Tuesday, November 3, 1959, at the hour of seven-thirty o'clock (7:30 P.M. C.S.T.) in regular session with Mayor Thos. L. Lemon presiding.

Members present: Graves, Chitwood, Stikeleather, Sikes, Miller, Peace, and Van Meter.

Members absent: None.

The meeting was opened with a prayer by Reverend Howard Anderson of the First Christian Church.

Councilman Sikes moved, seconded by Councilman Chitwood that the minutes of the last regular meeting be approved as submitted to each individual councilman; motion unanimously carried.

Councilman Sikes introduced Ordinance No. 18, 1959 for first reading by the Clerk-Treasurer.

Councilman Sikes introduced Ordinance No. 19, 1959 for first reading by the Clerk-Treasurer.

Councilman Sikes introduced Ordinance No. 20, 1959 for first reading by the Clerk-Treasurer. Councilman Sikes moved, seconded by Councilman Chitwood that Ordinance No. 20, 1959 be advanced to second reading by title only. Upon a roll call vote the motion was unanimously carried. After second reading by the Clerk-Treasurer by title only, Councilman Graves moved, seconded by Councilman Chitwood that Ordinance No. 20, 1959 be duly adopted. Upon a roll call vote Ordinance No. 20, 1959 was unanimously adopted.

Fourteen property owners in the southeast section of Bloomington petitioned the Council not to extend Southdowns Street eastward to intersect with High Street. This petition was referred to the Board of Public Works and Safety for investigation.

Councilman Peace reported that the Public Utilities Committee had restudied between University Street and Second Street on South Grant Street and find that a light in this location would aid greatly to the safety and convenience of the citizens in that area and moved, that the Common Council accept the recommendation; motion unanimously carried.


Reports for the month of October, 1959 were received from the Fire Department and Plumbing Inspector.

The Mayor requested that the Council instruct the City Attorney to prepare the necessary legal papers to transfer City ownership of the Aviation Department to County ownership.

Councilman Sikes moved, seconded by Councilman Van Meter that the City Attorney be instructed to prepare the necessary legal papers to transfer City ownership of the Aviation Department to County ownership; motion unanimously carried.


Councilman Chitwood moved, seconded by Councilman Graves that the claims be allowed as submitted for payment November 4, 1959; motion unanimously carried.
