

REGULAR MEETING

May 6, 1958

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA, met in the Council Chambers in City Hall, on Tuesday, May 6, 1958, at the hour of seven-thirty o'clock (7:30 P.M. D.S.T.) in regular session with Mayor Thos. L. Lemon presiding.

Members present: Graves, Chitwood, Griffith, Sikes, Miller, Simpson, and Van Meter.

Members absent: None.

The meeting was opened with a prayer by Councilman Graves.

Councilman Sikes moved, seconded by Councilman Chitwood that the minutes of the last regular meeting of April 15, 1958 be approved as submitted; motion unanimously carried.

Councilman Sikes moved, seconded by Councilman Simpson that Ordinance No. 7, 1958 be advanced to second reading by title only. Upon a roll call vote the motion was unanimously carried.

After second reading by the Clerk-Treasurer, Councilman Sikes moved, seconded by Councilman Graves that Ordinance No. 7, 1958 be duly adopted. Upon a roll call vote Ordinance No. 7, 1958 was unanimously adopted.

Councilman Sikes moved, seconded by Councilman Simpson that Ordinance No. 8, 1958 be advanced to second reading by title only. Upon a roll call vote the motion was unanimously carried.

After second reading by the Clerk-Treasurer, Councilman Simpson moved, seconded by Councilman Graves that Ordinance No. 8, 1958 be duly adopted. Upon a roll call vote Ordinance No. 8, 1958 was unanimously adopted.

Councilman Sikes introduced an ordinance pertinent to adopting a revision and codification of the Ordinances of the City of Bloomington, Indiana for first reading. After first reading by the Clerk-Treasurer, Councilman Graves moved, seconded by Councilman Simpson that Ordinance No. 9, 1958 be advanced to second reading by title only. Upon a roll call vote the motion was unanimously carried.

After second reading by the Clerk-Treasurer, Councilman Simpson moved, seconded by Councilman Chitwood that Ordinance No. 9, 1958 be duly adopted. Upon a roll call vote Ordinance No. 9, 1958 was unanimously adopted.

The Clerk-Treasurer read a petition to cut the curb at 730 South Woodlawn Avenue at the residence of Eugene H. Bender. Councilman Simpson moved, seconded by Councilman Graves that this petition be referred to the proper committee with power to act under the supervision of the City Engineer; motion unanimously carried.

Monthly reports were received from the Water, Sanitation, Street, and Fire Departments and the Plumbing Inspector and placed on file.

Councilman Chitwood moved, seconded by Councilman Graves that the claims presented for payment May 7, 1958 be allowed as submitted; motion unanimously carried.
