

REGULAR MEETING

December 16, 1958

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA, met in the Council Chambers in City Hall, on Tuesday, December 16, 1958, at the hour of seven-thirty o'clock (7:30 P.M. C.S.T.) in regular session with Mayor Thos. L. Lemon presiding.

Members present: Graves, Chitwood, Griffith, Sikes, Miller, Van Meter, and Simpson.

Members absent: None.

The meeting was opened with a prayer by Reverend Robert Hazen of the First Church of God.

Councilman Sikes moved, seconded by Councilman Simpson that the minutes be approved as submitted to each individual Councilman; motion unanimously carried.

The following Bloomington Traffic Commission report was read by the Clerk-Treasurer:

BLOOMINGTON TRAFFIC COMMISSION

TO: THE MAYOR AND THE COMMON COUNCIL OF BLOOMINGTON

AT the December meeting of the Traffic Commission, below listed traffic and related recommendations were adopted and are herewith submitted to the Mayor and the Common Council for consideration and action.

1. A recommendation was approved to eliminate all parking on both sides of Third Street from College to the Monon Railroad.
2. A recommendation was approved to establish the intersection at 8th street and Clark as a non-preferential thoroughfare. The three existing stop-signs to be removed leaving the "stop" "dead-end" sign on the north-east corner. It was determined that no traffic control devices are necessary at this intersection.

Councilman Simpson moved, seconded by Councilman Graves that the Chief of Police by executive order ban all parking on the south side of 13th Street from Forrest Street to Fee Lane for a period of 90 days; motion unanimously carried.

Reports were received and placed on file from the Water Department and Sanitation Department.

A report to the Council from the Clerk-Treasurer on sewer hook-ons and Sewage Works Improvement Bonds of 1955 was received and placed on file.

Councilman Simpson moved, seconded by Councilman Van Meter that the claims be approved as submitted; motion unanimously carried.
