

September 3, 1957

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA, met in the Council Chambers in City Hall, on Tuesday, September 3, 1957, at the hour of seven-thirty o'clock. (7:30 P.M. D.S.T.) in regular session with Mayor Thos. L. Lemon presiding.

Members present: Miller, Chitwood, Simpson, Sikes, Van Meter, and Griffith.

Members absent: None.

Griffith moved, seconded by Councilman Simpson that the minutes of the regular meeting of August 20, 1957 be approved as published; motion unanimously carried.

Councilman Sikes moved, seconded by Councilman Chitwood that the minutes of the special meeting of August 26, 1957 be approved as amended; motion unanimously carried.

Councilman Sikes presented Ordinance No. 17, 1957, and moved, seconded by Councilman Griffith that Ordinance No. 17, 1957 be advanced to second reading by title only. Upon a roll call vote the motion was unanimously carried.

After second reading by title only by the Clerk-Treasurer, Councilman Sikes moved, seconded by Councilman Griffith that Ordinance No. 17, 1957 be duly adopted. Upon a roll call vote Ordinance No. 17, 1957 was duly adopted.

Councilman Sikes presented Ordinance No. 18, 1957 for second reading and moved, seconded by Councilman Chitwood that Ordinance No. 18, 1957 be advanced to second reading by title only. Upon a roll call vote the motion was unanimously carried.

After Second reading by title only by the Clerk-Treasurer, Councilman Simpson moved, seconded by Councilman Van Meter that Ordinance No. 18, 1957 be duly adopted. Upon a roll call vote Ordinance No. 18, 1957 was duly adopted.

Councilman Simpson moved, seconded by Councilman Chitwood that the petition for two street lights at East Wylie Street and Dunn Street and East Wylie Street and Palmer Street be referred to the proper committee for further investigation and report at next Council meeting; motion unanimously carried.

In accordance with the provisions of Chapter 249, Acts of the Indiana General Assembly for 1957, the undersigned hereby offers to sell to The City of Bloomington that real estate commonly known as "Banneker School" for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00). It has heretofore been determined by us that said real estate is not needed or required for school purposes.

As we understand the provisions of said law, upon being advised by you of your acceptance of this offer and approval thereof by way of ratification or confirmation on the part of the City by an ordinance duly adopted by the Common Council, we will execute and deliver to you a warranty deed conveying said real estate.

Councilman Miller moved, seconded by Councilman Van Meter that the Traffic Schedule of the Traffic Ordinance be amended changing the loading zone signs on East First Street across from Whaley Market to fifteen (15) minute parking zones and that action be taken immediately; motion unanimously carried.

Councilman Simpson moved, seconded by Councilman Chitwood that the report of the Plumbing Inspector and the Fire Chief for the month of August be accepted and placed on file; motion unanimously carried.

Recess

Mayor Thos. L. Lemon gave oath of office to Mr. Hilbert H. Graves to serve as Common Councilman at large to fill the vacancy created by Mr. Rob Cook's resignation. Mr. Graves was then seated and assumed his duties as a member of the Common Council.

Councilman Griffith moved, seconded by Councilman Simpson that the newly elected Councilman Hilber Graves be assigned to the committees served by former Councilman Rob Cook and that Councilman Chitwood be advanced to chairman of the Committee on Finance, Claims and Franchises; motion unanimously carried.

Councilman Simpson moved, seconded by Councilman Sikes that the claims be approved as presented; motion unanimously carried.

Meeting adjourned.
