

## REGULAR MEETING

Tuesday, November 6, 1956

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA, met in the Council Chamber in City Hall, on Tuesday, November 6, 1956, at the hour of seven-thirty o'clock (7:30 P.M., DST) in regular session, with Mayor Lemon presiding. The meeting was opened with a prayer by Rev. Howard Anderson of the First Christian Church.

Members present: Cook, Miller, Van Meter, Engelman, Chitwood, and Sikes.

Members absent: Simpson.

The minutes of the former meeting were read by the Clerk-Treasurer. After the reading of the minutes, Councilman Cook moved; seconded by Councilman Chitwood, that the minutes be approved as read. Motion carried.

Councilman Miller moved, seconded by Councilman Chitwood, that the request of Mr. \_\_\_\_\_ pertinent to parking on 14th and Forest Street be referred to the Traffic Commission for further study and then referred back to the Common Council. Motion carried.

An ordinance pertinent to annexation in the Pine Crest Addition was given second reading by the Clerk-Treasurer. Councilman Cook moved, seconded by Councilman Sikes, that Ordinance No. 29, 1956, be duly adopted. Upon roll-call vote, the motion unanimously carried subject only to its publication in accordance with the law.

A request for curb cutting was read by the Clerk-Treasurer as follows:

Gentlemen:

We are asking permission to cut the curb at our residence at 417 E. University and to put in a drive. We do not have a drive at the present time and because of the one-side parking on our street the space is limited.

Councilman Cook moved, seconded by Councilman Miller, that the petition be referred to the Street and Alley Committee. Motion carried.

Councilman Cook moved, seconded by Councilman Chitwood, that the recommendations of the September 11, 1956, Traffic Commission Meeting, as presented to the Common Council on September 18, 1956, be adopted with the exception of Item No. One (1), and that the Traffic Schedule of the Traffic Ordinance be changed accordingly. Motion carried.

Councilman Cook moved, seconded by Councilman Sikes, that the recommendations of the October 9, 1956, Traffic Commission Meeting be adopted and that the Traffic Schedule of the Traffic Ordinance be changed accordingly. Motion carried. October 9, 1956, Traffic Commission Meeting recommendations as follows:

"TO THE MAYOR AND COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON:

At the meeting of the Bloomington Traffic Commission of October 9, 1956 the following recommendations were made to the Mayor and Common Council of Bloomington:

1. It is recommended that all parking be prohibited on South Fairview Street from the R.C.A. Parking lot to Allen Street.
2. It was recommended that parking be prohibited on the West side of Morton Street from Allen Street to Grimes Lane.

3. It is recommended that stop signs be erected at Woodlawn and 7th requiring all traffic entering this intersection on 7th Street and all traffic entering said intersection from the north on Woodlawn to stop.

It is further recommended that the Street Department paint pedestrian crosswalks on that portion of the intersection in the city and that Indiana University be requested to paint pedestrian crosswalks in that portion of the intersection which is situated on I.U. property.

Councilman Sikes moved, seconded by Councilman Chitwood, that the October reports from the Plumbing, Street, and Fire Departments be approved and placed on file. Motion carried.

Mayor Lemon reported on the ordinance regulating the shooting of ducks on the lake. The City Attorney studied the ordinance and interpreted the ordinance as allowing the shooting of ducks during the legal season. The old ordinance would have to be revoked by the Common Council if shooting of ducks was not to be permitted. Councilman Miller suggested leaving things stand as is.

Councilman Chitwood moved, seconded by Councilman Sikes, that the claims for November 6, 1956, be approved. Motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned by Mayor Lemon.
