The report of Roy Doub, Plumbing Inspector, for the month of January, 1955, was approved as read on motion of Councilman Donham, seconded by Councilman Carpenter.

The report of J. N. Gilmore, Street Commissioner, for the month of January, 1955, was accepted as presented on motion of Councilman Porter, seconded by Councilman Donham.

The report of Horace Robertson, Chief of the Fire Department, for the month of January, 1955, was presented and approved on motion of Councilman Carpenter, seconded by Councilman Van Meter.

The report of the Park Department presented by Mr. Eugene Bender for the year 1954 was accepted as read on motion of Councilman Miller, seconded by Councilman Porter.

Councilman Domham reported for the Committee on Public Works in connection with investigation made of the request of Mr. Jesse E. Jones, 718 East 11th Street, for permission to cut curb, and with the approval of the Committee, moved that the permit be granted providing the work is done according to the specifications and under the supervision of the City Engineer. Councilman Carpenter seconded motion; motion carried.

Councilman Van Meter, reporting for the Committee on Finances, Claims, and Franchises, stated that the Committee had investigated the applications for Taxi Cab Licenses for Red Top Cab, Yellow Cab, I.U. Cab and Campus Cab Companies, and found them to be in order. Councilman Griffith moved that the licenses be continued for the year, 1955; seconded by Councilman Porter; motion carried.

Councilman Ramsey moved that the Council as a whole at the next meeting consider a Resolution which would state their approval of the Bricker Amendment and their realization of its significance to county, state, and country, and that copies be sent to elected representatives and senators. Councilman Carpenter seconded motion; motion carried.
