On motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, said notice and the proof of service were approved as being in conformity with the rules of the Council, and the same were ordered made a part of the minutes of this meeting. City Attorney McCrea presented to the Council for consideration an Ordinance ratifying the contract between the Board of Public Works and Safety and Sarkes Tarzian, Inc., and the Clerk-Treasurer read the Ordinance to the Council.

Councilman Miller moved the suspension of rules so that the Ordinance might be considered at this meeting; Councilman Porter seconded the motion; MayornKellyirequested a roll call vote, and the response was as follows: Ayes: Carpenter, Fowler, Griffith, McDaniel, Miller, and Porter; Nays:: none; Absent: Ramsey; motion carried.

Councilman Miller moved the adoption of Ordinance No. 5, 1953, entitled "An Ordinance concerning the acquisition of a Sewer Line, and conforming, ratifying, and approving a Contract, dated March 6, 1953, between the City of Bloomington, Indiana, through its Board of Public Works and Safety, and Sarkes Tarzian, Inc." Councilman Fowler seconded the motion; on a roll call vote, the response was as follows: Ayes: Carpenter, Fowler, Griffith, McDaniel, Miller, and Porter; Nays: none; Absent: Ramsey. Mayor Kelly declared the Ordinance No. 5, 1953, duly passed and adopted.

City Attorney McCrea read the State Statute concerning such an action by the City Council, pointing out particularly provision for filing of objection by forty affected persons within twenty days.

Upon motion of Councilman Carpenter, seconded by Councilman Porter, the meeting adjourned.
