

## REGULAR MEETING

Tuesday, August 19, 1952

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA, met in regular session in the Council Chamber at the City Hall, Bloomington, Indiana, August 19, 1952, at the hour of six-thirty (6:30) P.M., with Mayor Kelly presiding.

Members present: Carpenter, Fowler, Griffith, McDaniel, and Miller

Members absent: Porter and Ramsey

The minutes of the previous meeting were approved on motion of Councilman Carpenter, seconded by Councilman Miller.

A request was received from Winchell B. Everman for permission to extend the cut of the alley curb at 907-909 South Rogers Street an additional seven feet South. Councilman Fowler advised that the Committee on Streets, Alleys, and Bridges had already investigated this matter, and recommended that permission be granted as requested. Mr. Fowler moved that permission be granted and the work proceed under the supervision of the City Engineer. Councilman McDaniel seconded the motion; motion carried.


Councilman Fowler reported that the Committee on Streets, Alleys, and Bridges had not come to any conclusion in connection with the request to vacate property on South Walnut Street on behalf of Sarkes Tarzian, et al. After open discussion by the Council, Councilman Carpenter moved that the request be granted; Councilman Fowler seconded the motion. Mayor Kelly requested a roll call vote, and the response was as follows: Ayes: Carpenter, Fowler, Griffith, McDaniel, and Miller; Nays: none; absent: Porter and Ramsey. The motion carried.

A petition was received from residents in the vicinity of the intersection of First Street and Mitchell Street, requesting installation of a street light at the intersection. Councilman Miller moved that the matter be referred to the Committee on Sidewalks and Street Lighting for investigation; Councilman Carpenter seconded the motion; motion carried.

Robert Dempsey, 407 West Grimes Lane, requested the Council to assist him in the parking problem in front of his home, where the curb had been broken down, and cars parked against his house so that entrance could not be made, and causing a serious problem because of illness in his home. Councilman Miller moved that the matter be referred to the Committee on Streets, Alleys, and Bridges. Councilman Carpenter seconded the motion with an amendment, accepted by Mr. Miller, that the Street Commissioner be instructed to investigate this situation immediately because of the adverse conditions of illness in the family, and place "No Parking" signs in front of Mr. Dempsey's residence. On vote, the motion as amended passed unanimously.

Mayor Kelly and the Councilmen expressed interest and pleasure in having as visitors for the meeting a group of students from other countries who were participating in the International Orientation course at Indiana University, and were introduced by Dr. T. M. Sonneborn.

Councilman Carpenter moved the meeting adjourn; Councilman Fowler seconded the motion; motion carried.
