

REGULAR MEETING

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 7, 1950.

THE COMMON COUNCIL of the City of Bloomington met in the Council Chambers in the City Hall on November 7, 1950, at the hour of 7:00 o'clock P. M., in regular session.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Thomas L. Lemon, who presided.

On call of the roll the members of the Council were shown to be present or absent as follows:

Present: Chitwood, Dunn, Parks, Shank, Sikes and Woolery.
Absent: Black.

Councilman Chitwood moved the ^{reading of the} minutes of the last meeting be dispensed with. Motion seconded by Councilman Shank and carried.

An application was presented to the Council from George E. Huntington asking permission to cut the curb for a distance of 18' at his premises at 817 South Fess Ave. Councilman Shank moved this petition be granted under the supervision of City Engineer. Seconded by Councilman Chitwood, motion carried.


An application was presented from Dr. & Mrs. William Prosser asking permission to cut curb for a distance of 10 feet along the back of the sidewalk at their property on 1211 Maxwell Lane. Councilman Shank moved this petition be tabled until further investigation. Seconded by Councilman Chitwood, motion carried.

A petition signed by eight property owners asking for a street light at the intersection of East Second and South Mitchell Sts. was presented. The petition was turned over to the Light Committee for investigation and report at next meeting of the Council, upon motion made by Councilman Shank, seconded by Councilman Parks, and carried.

CLAIMS:

Upon motion by Councilwoman Woolery, seconded by Councilman Parks and carried, Claims Nos. 3007 to 3185, inclusive, with the exceptions of 3027, 3031 and 3126 were approved and warrants ordered issued in the total amount of \$38,284.60.

Upon motion by Councilman Chitwood, seconded by Councilman Shank, the meeting adjourned.
