The Council Land Use Committee met on September 9, 2020 to consider this ordinance. The committee do pass recommendation received a vote of 4-0. A signed report from the Committee on this item will be distributed in advance of the September 16 Regular Session.

This ordinance was distributed in a Packet Addendum on September 9, 2020 in advance of that evening's Special Session of the Council. It was introduced for first reading on September 9 and will be considered under second reading during the Regular Session on September 16.

The ordinance would 1) establish a non-reverting Sustainable Development Fund and 2) amend Title 2 of the Bloomington Municipal Code to create a Sustainable Development Fund Advisory Commission. The ordinance would only take effect upon the passage of an



economic development income tax ("EDIT") rate under Indiana Code § 6-3.6-6-4 by the Monroe County Tax Council (proposed by Resolution 20-13 and currently the subject of council consideration).

Establishment of Sustainable Development Fund

Sections 1-5 of the ordinance pertain to a new Sustainable Development Fund ("Fund") that would be created with the passage of <u>Ordinance 20-16</u>. The Fund would receive revenue from an EDIT to be used for any of <u>the purposes listed under state law as permissible</u>. The ordinance states that before the Council may adopt legislation requiring the expenditure of EDIT revenue, it must first receive a written recommendation from a Sustainable Development Fund Advisory Commission ("Commission") (discussed below) on the proposed expenditure. Note that this would not require the *approval* of such a body, but rather a recommendation on the proposed expenditure.

Creation of Sustainable Development Fund Advisory Commission

Section 6 of the ordinance would add a new Chapter 2.35 entitled "Sustainable Development Fund Advisory Commission" to the Bloomington Municipal Code.

- A new BMC 2.35.010 would establish a Sustainable Development Fund Advisory Commission and provides that its purpose would be to make recommendations on appropriations from the Fund while also evaluating the effectiveness of expenditures in achieving adopted city goals.
- A new BMC 2.35.020 details the membership of the Commission.
- A new BMC 2.35.030 lists the qualifications for citizen appointments to the Commission, who at a minimum must be eighteen years of age, reside in the city, and have a demonstrated commitment to furthering the goals of various adopted city plans.
- A new BMC 2.35.040 details the terms appointees would serve on the Commission.
- A new BMC 2.35.050 addresses the powers and duties of the Commission, including:
 - o how the Commission would form funding priorities and recommendations:
 - o how the Commission would report on its activities; and
 - o how the Commission's activities will be accessible to the public.


Statement on public meetings during public health emergency:
