Sims made a Disclosure of Conflict of Interest related to his wife, Doris Sims, who served as the Director of Housing and Neighborhood Development Department. Sims said that he would be able to vote on the budget fairly, objectively, and in the public's interest.	
Volan moved and it was seconded to accept the conflict of interest disclosure. The council did not take a vote after Dan Sherman, Council Attorney, said it was not necessary.


