~~WHEREAS, the standing committee system established last year has made the legislative process more accessible to city departments, city residents, and the various petitioners that come before the Council, and has provided more opportunities for concerned residents to be heard; and~~

~~WHEREAS, standing committees have allowed Councilmembers to better manage their workload and time while responding to changing community priorities, have provided predictability in meeting scheduling and duration; and~~

~~WHEREAS, despite having extended the default legislative cycle, standing committees have held only a fraction of legislative items for extended deliberation; and~~

Synopsis

This amendment is sponsored by Councilmember Sgambelluri. It removes the first three Whereas clauses from the resolution to avoid implying there is a consensus on the assessment of the Council's standing committees and their impact on the legislative process, as there are a variety of opinions among stakeholders.

Synopsis

This amendment is sponsored by Councilmember Sgambelluri. The Sustainable Development Committee has evolved to focus on the City's economic vision and, most recently, the response to COVID-19's devastating impact on local employers. These efforts have primarily been in coordination with the Department of Economic and Sustainable Development. In contrast, Bloomington's response to climate change must involve every City department as well as multiple boards and commissions, private sector partners, colleagues in County government, and others. A stand-alone Climate Action and Resilience Committee is better positioned to play such a boundary-spanning role.

2. Res 21-01 shall be amended by inserting a new Section 7 and by renumbering subsequent sections accordingly. The new Section 7 shall read as follows:

SECTION 7. Transportation Committee. The Transportation Committee shall, in addition to the functions provided for it in Resolution 20-01, subsume the responsibilities of the Council's Sidewalk Committee, which entail making recommendations to the full Council on the use of Alternative Transportation Fund monies specifically budgeted for Council recommended sidewalk and traffic-calming projects.

Synopsis

This amendment is sponsored by Councilmember Rosenbarger and specifies that the function performed by the Council Sidewalk Committee shall be performed by the Transportation Committee (in addition to the existing functions of the Transportation Committee).
