Statement on public meetings during public health emergency

As a result of Executive Orders issued by the Governor, the Commission and its committees may adjust normal meeting procedures to adhere to guidance provided by state officials. These adjustments may include:

- posting notices and agendas for meetings solely by electronic means;*
