The Bloomington Board of Public Safety held a Regular Session on **Tuesday, March 23rd, 2021, at 6:00 p.m.**, Teleconference/Virtual Meeting.

CALL TO ORDER

Board President Kim Gray called the meeting to order at approximately 6:02 p.m. Other Board members present were: Luis Fuentes-Rohwer and Shruti Rana. Board members Maqubé Reese and Rafi Hasan were not present.

APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS MEETING MINUTES

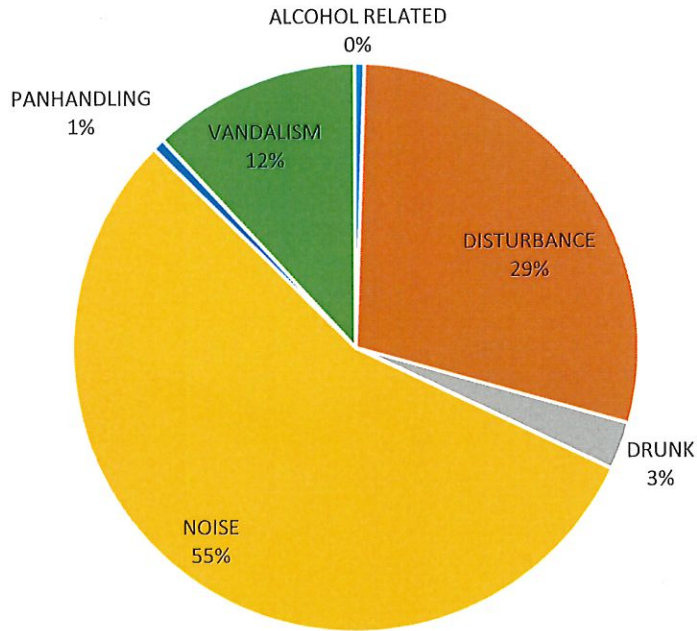

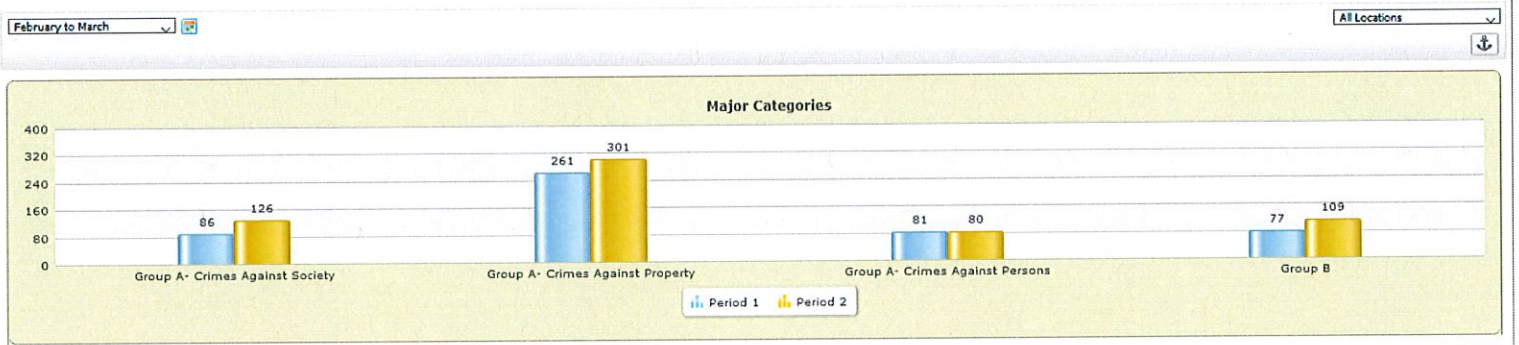
2020-2021 Calls For Service Totals



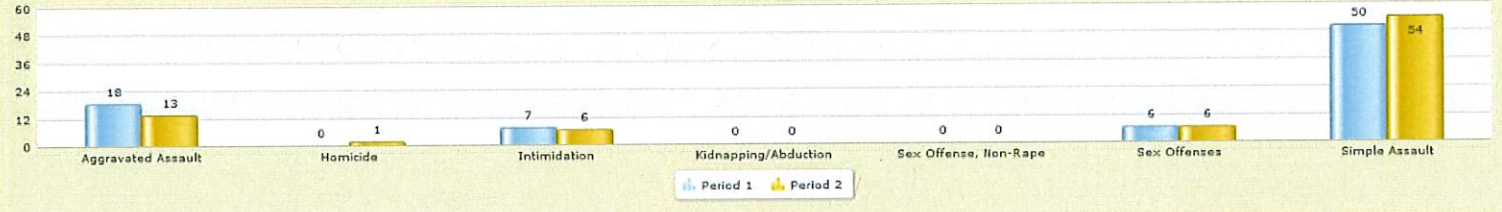
March 2021 Nuisance Calls for Service

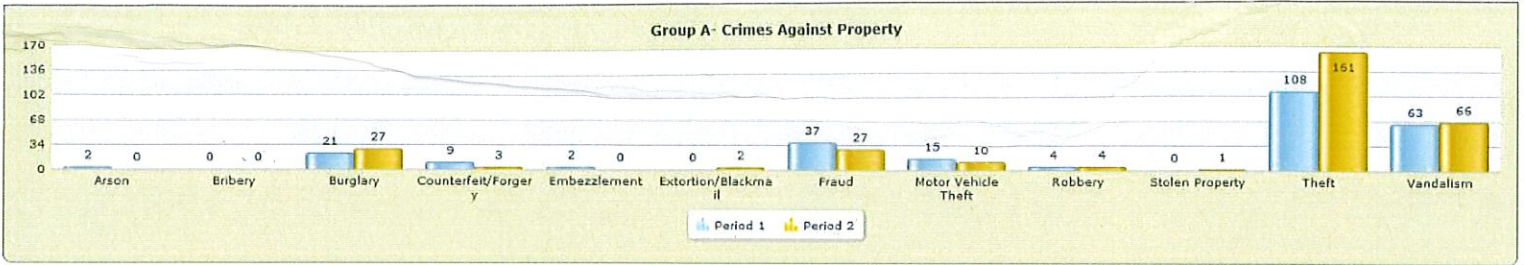

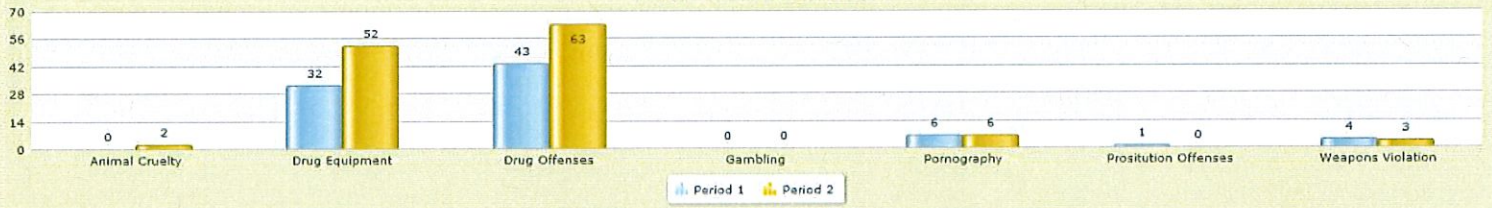

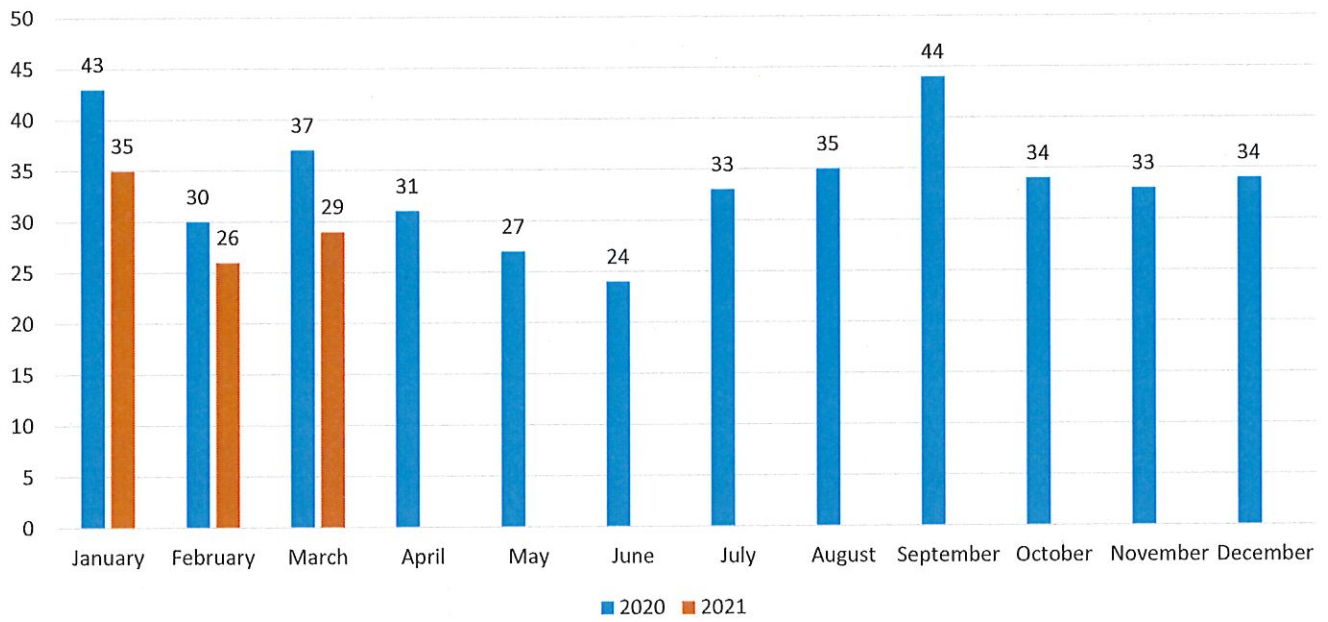
2020-2021 Adult Arrests

The COVID-19 pandemic put a great deal of pressure on the Indiana Law Enforcement Academy with all the changes, postponements, and suspensions. What didn't change was the backlog of officers needing basic training. The Bloomington Police Department gallantly volunteered to host a regional training site (RTS) to fulfill our obligation to train Hoosier officers. Sergeant Pam Gladish did a phenomenal job beginning the arduous process of getting the RTS started by organizing a curriculum, making arrangements for instructors and facilities as well as soliciting officers from neighboring communities to attend.

As it turns out, there seems to be little appetite in the Monroe County area for an RTS but that does not diminish the work put forth and your willingness to host the training.

On behalf of the ILEA, I want to personally thank you and Sergeant Gladish for the unselfish willingness to host the training. The four BPD officers who would have attended the training in Bloomington will be admitted to the ILEA class 2021-224 that begins on-line June 7, 2021 and will tentatively graduate September 17, 2021.

Thank you again for your unselfish professionalism.

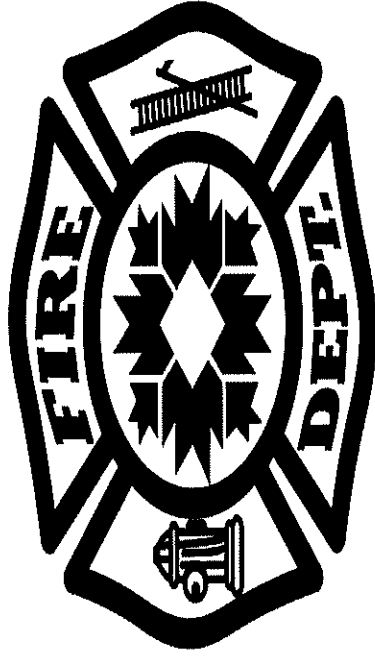

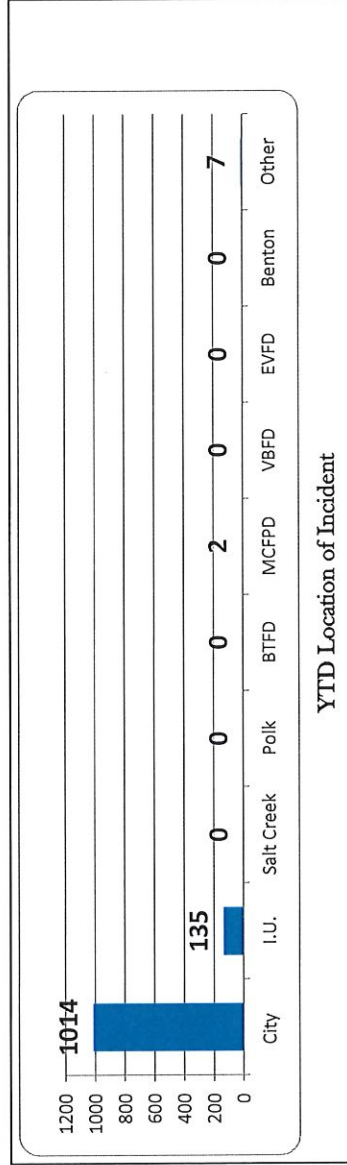
Operational Statistics

Year to Year Trend of Total Incidents

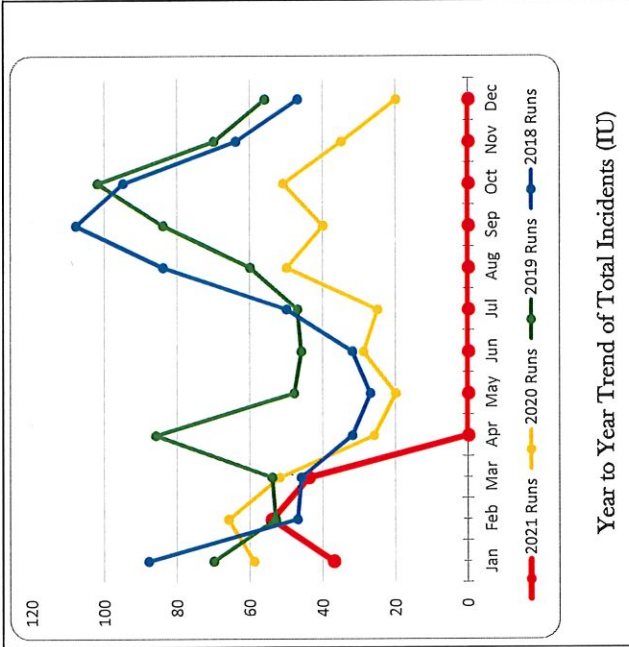
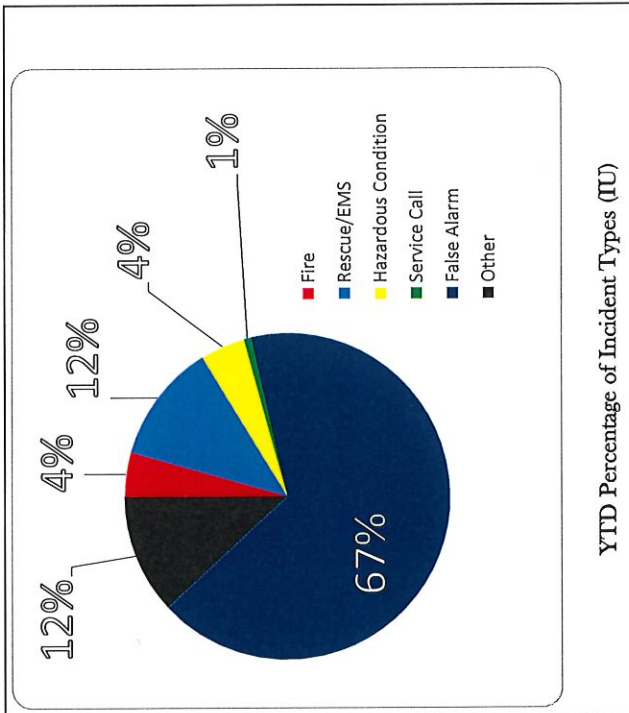

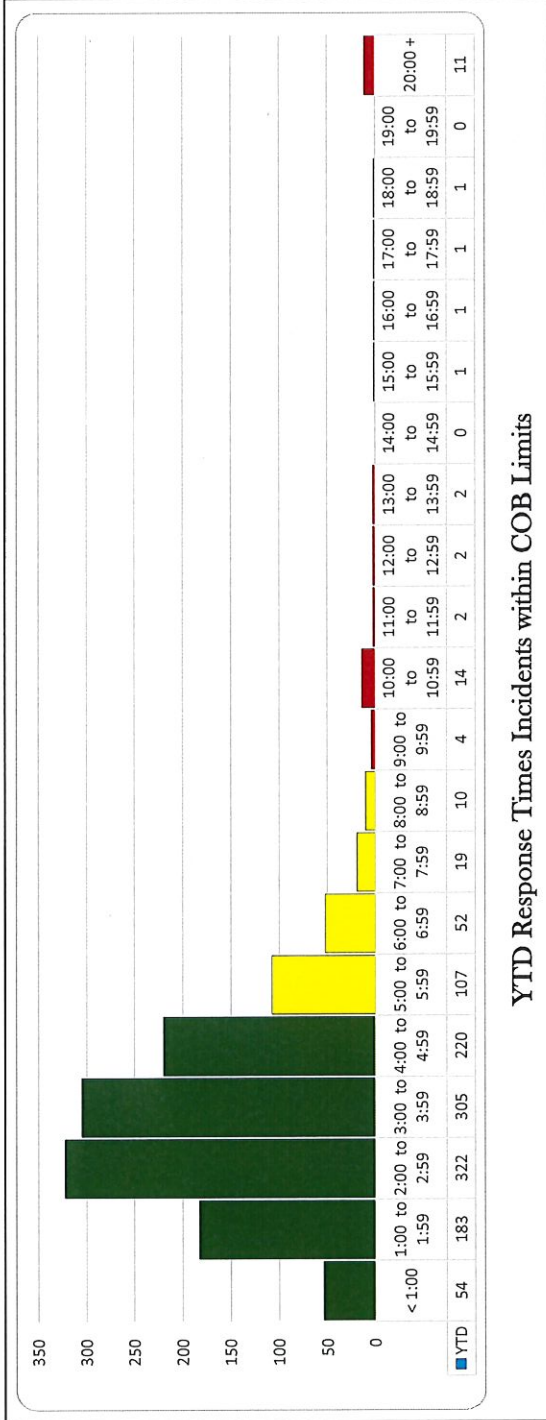

Response Times / Goals



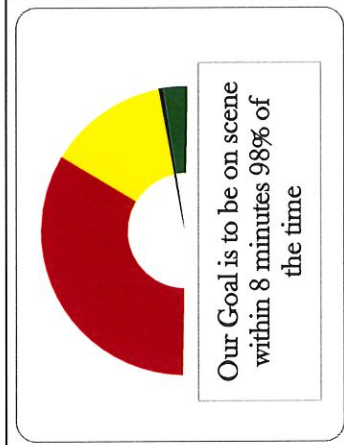
YTD Response Times Incidents within COB Limits

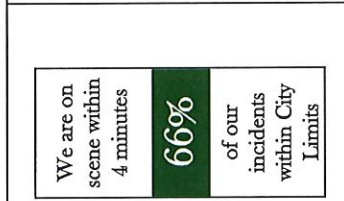

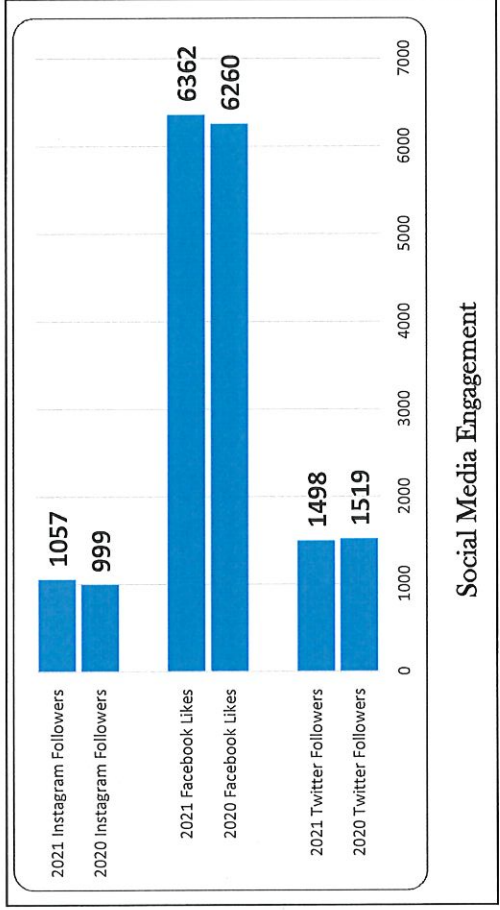
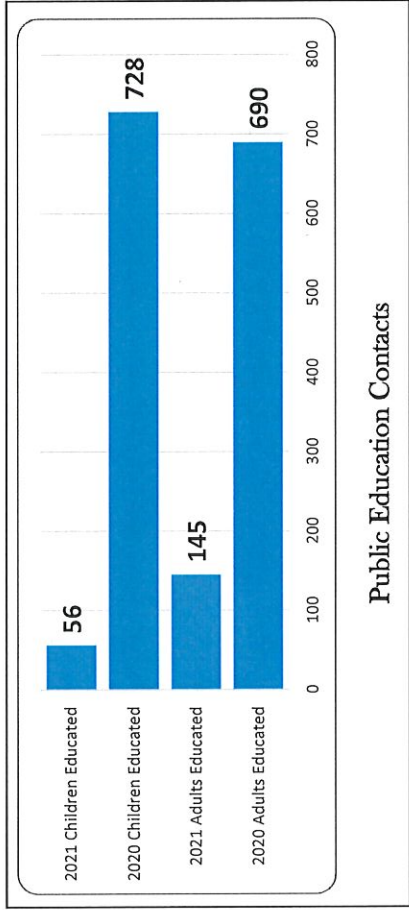


We are on scene within 8 minutes **96%** of our incidents within City Limits

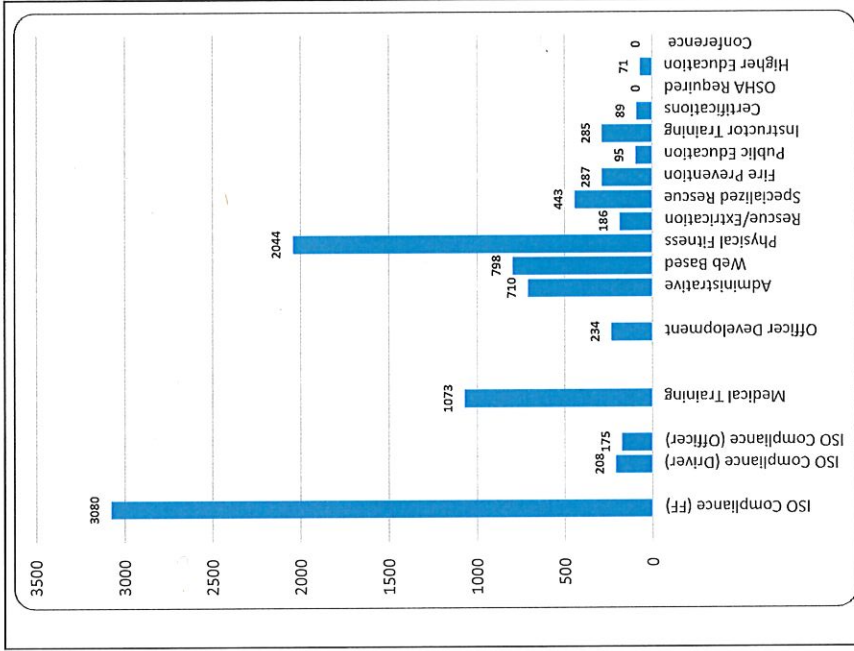
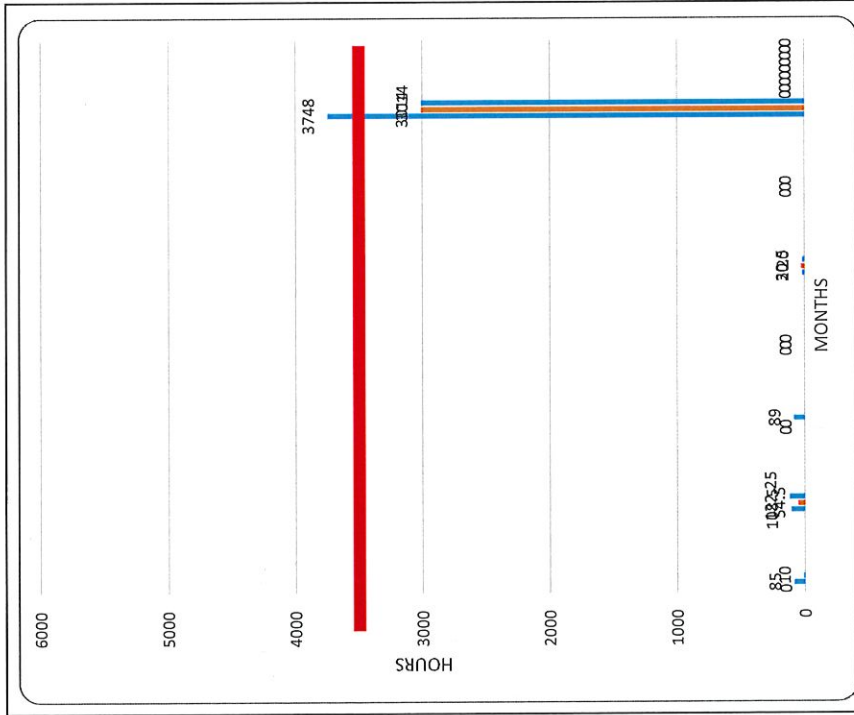
