BLOOMINGTON BOARD OF PUBLIC SAFETY

The Bloomington Board of Public Safety held a Regular Session on **Tuesday, September 21, 2021, at 6:00 p.m.**, Teleconference/Virtual Meeting.

CALL TO ORDER

Board President Kim Gray called the meeting to order at approximately 6:00 p.m. Board members Shruti Rana and Rafi Hasan were present. Board member Maqubé Reese joined during the Police Department update.

APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS MEETING MINUTES

Board member Rafi Hasan moved to approve the meeting minutes from August 17, 2021. Board member Shruti Rana seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously, 4-0, through a roll call vote by board recording secretary, Nicole DeCriscio Bowe.

POLICE DEPARTMENT BUSINESS

Report on Monthly Statistics, Training and Incident Reports:

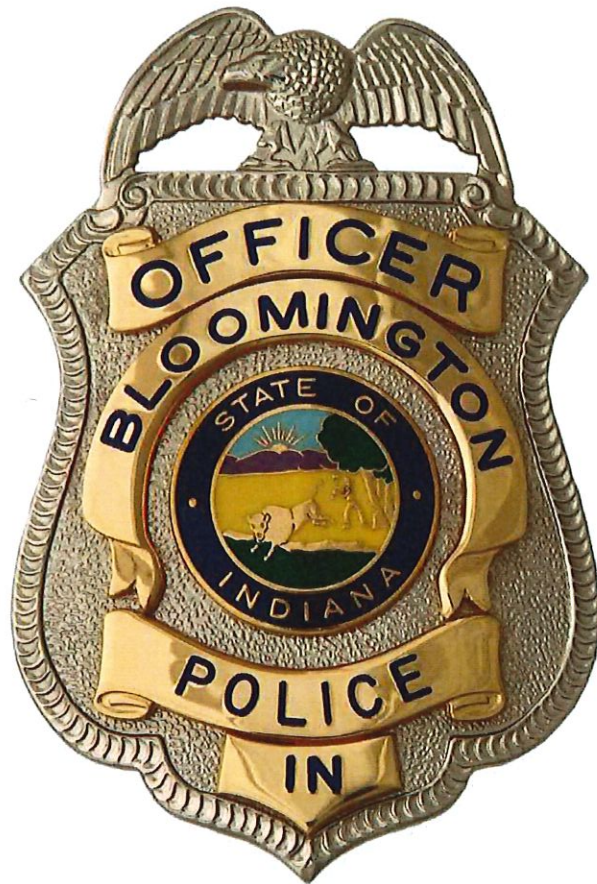

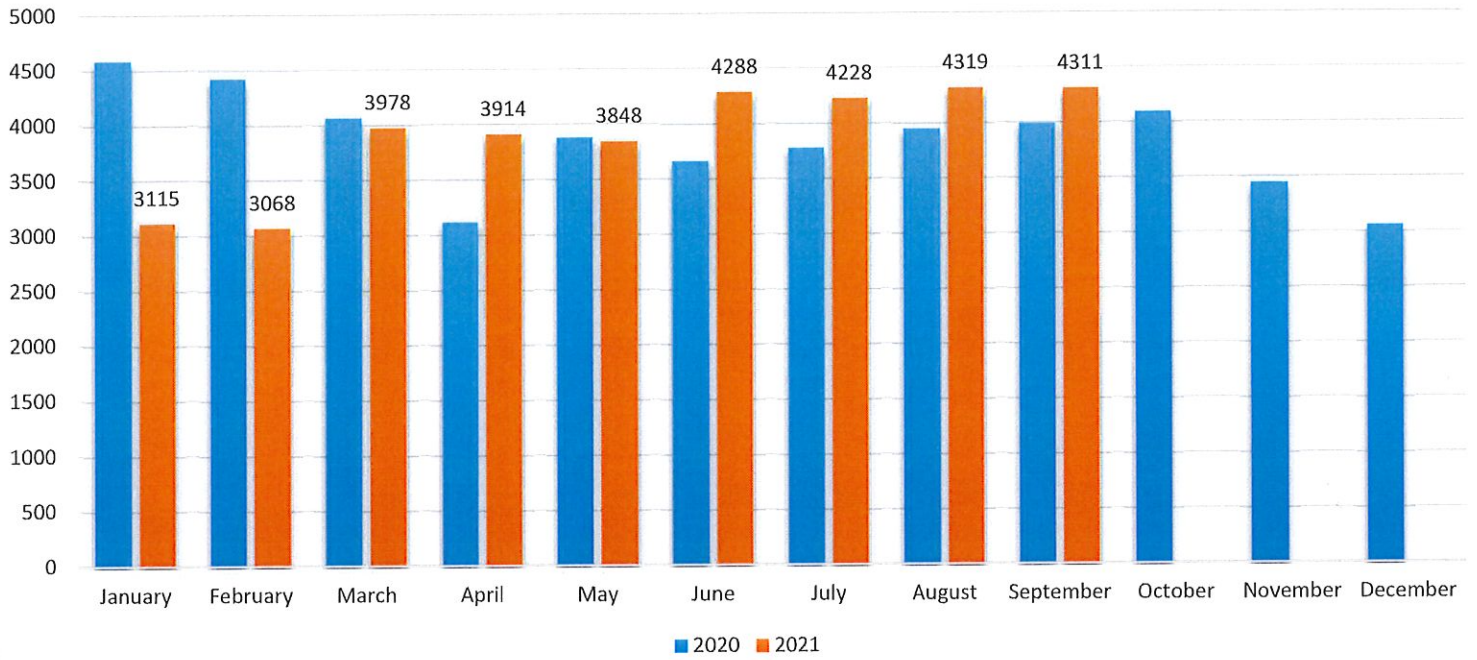

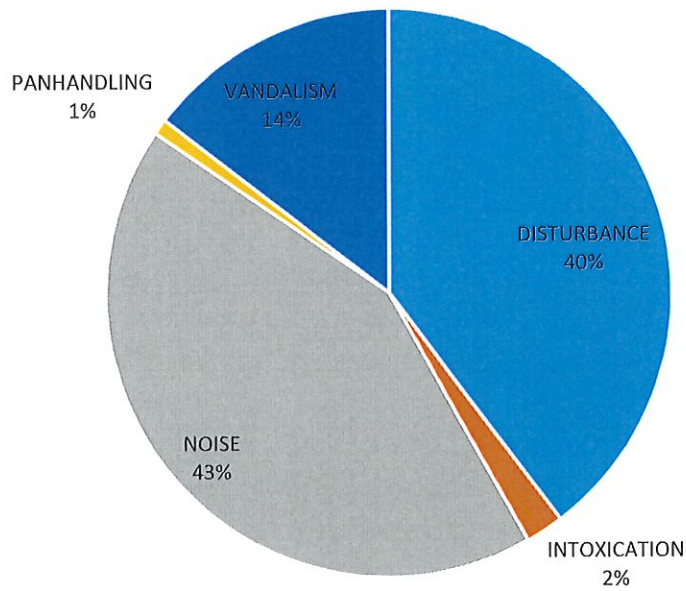

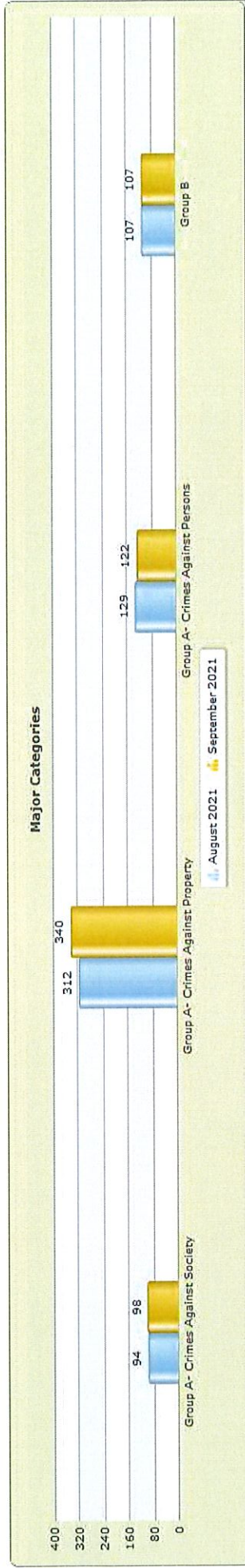
2020-2021 Calls For Service Totals



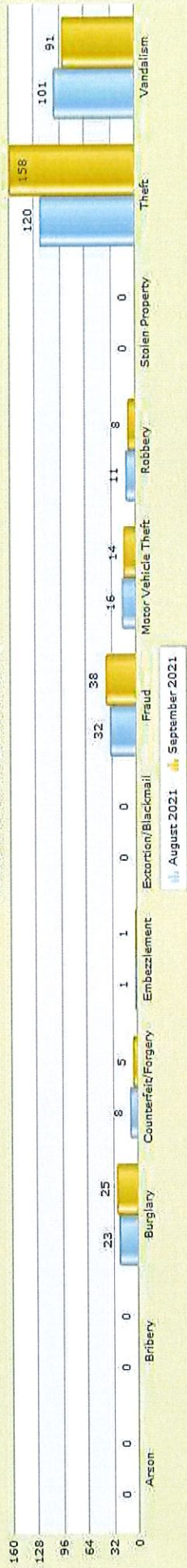
September 2021 Nuisance Calls for Service

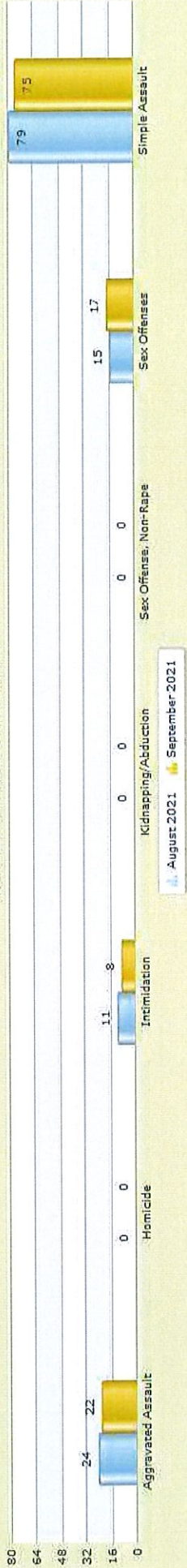

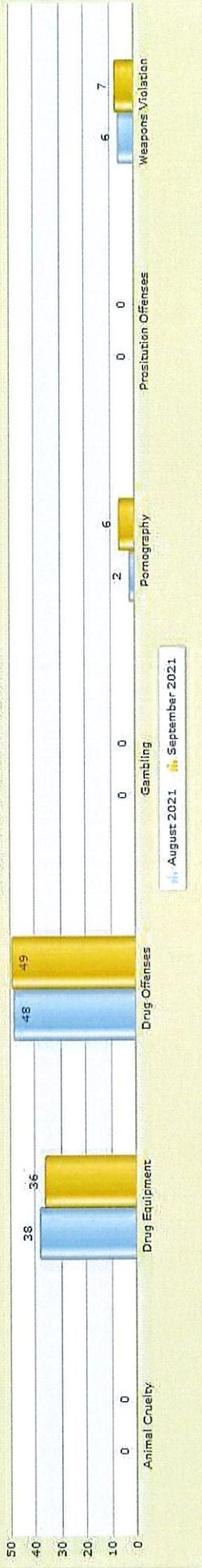

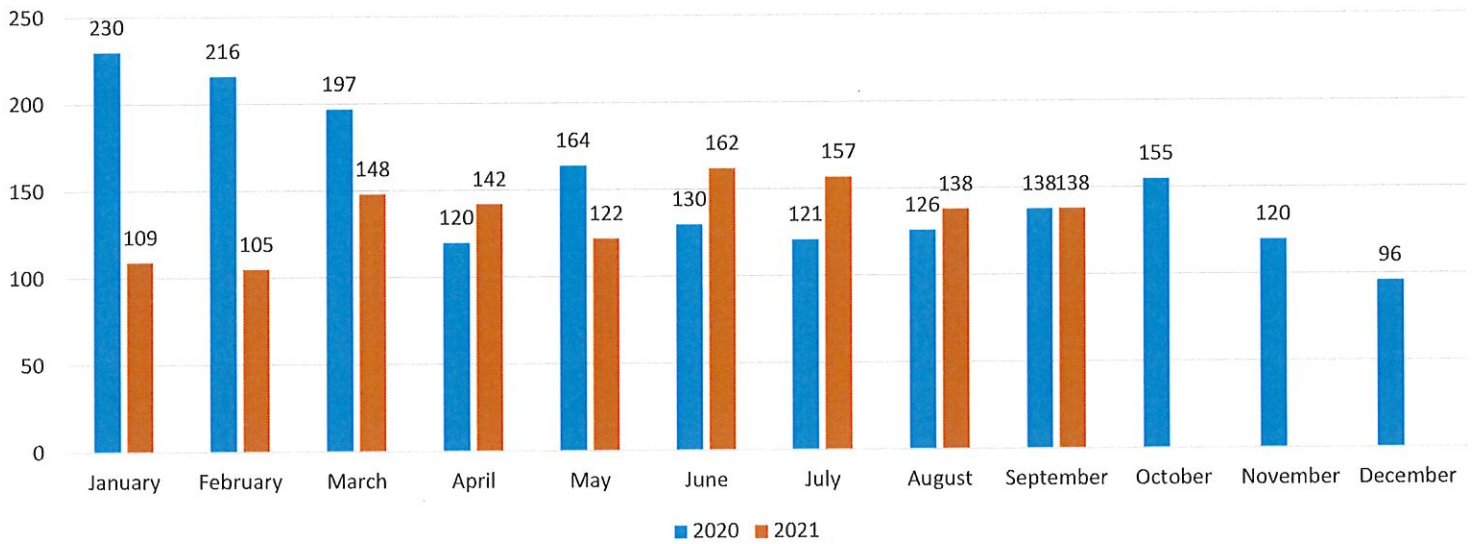

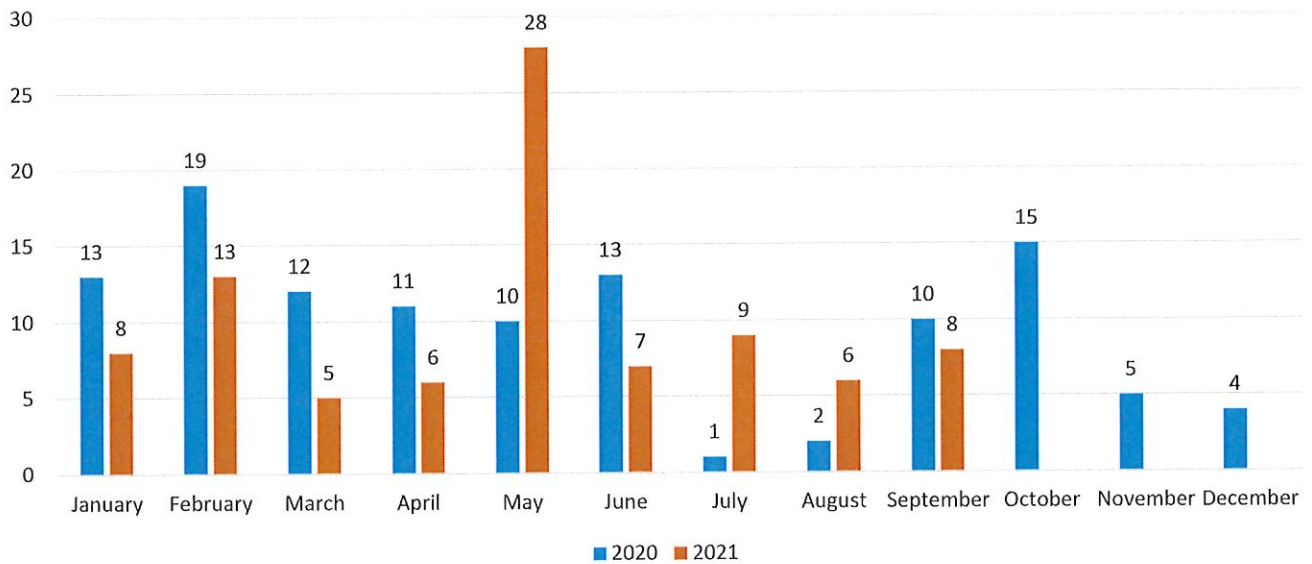

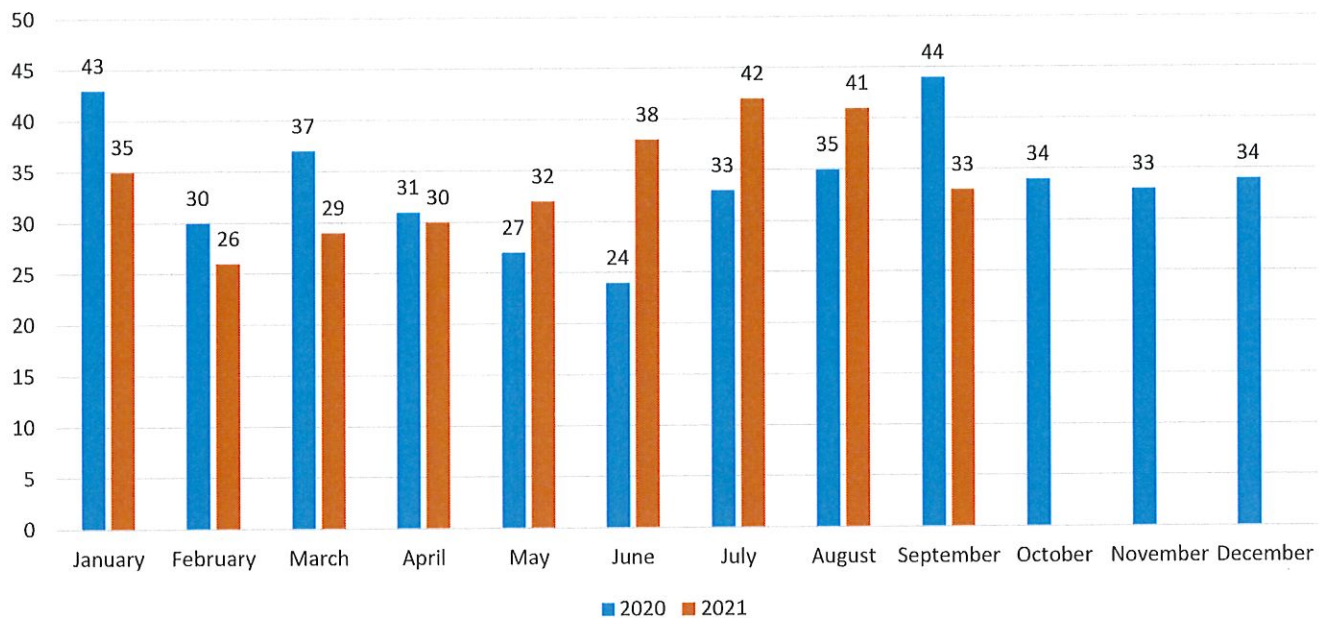
2020-2021 Adult Arrests

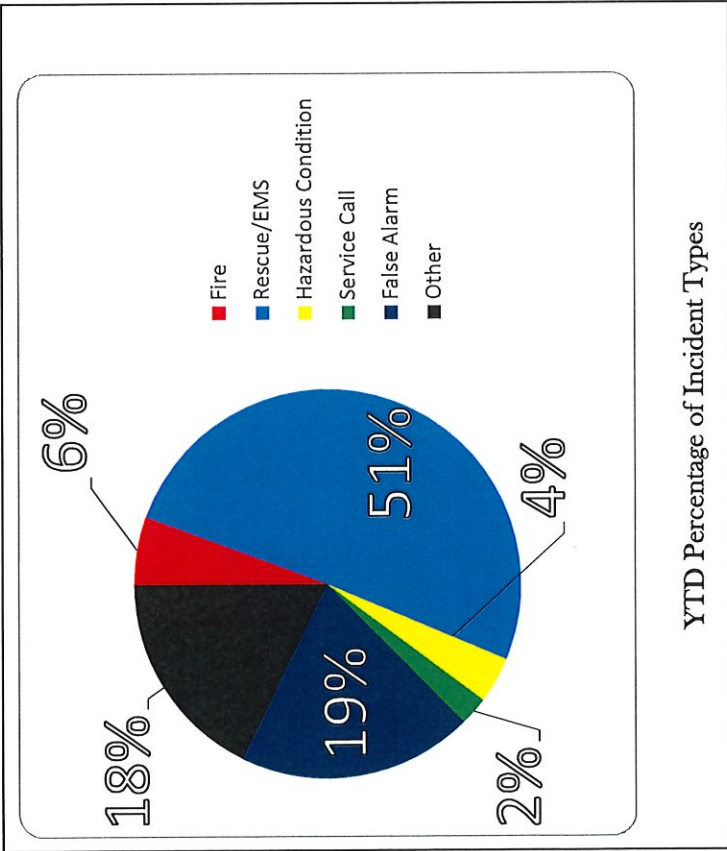

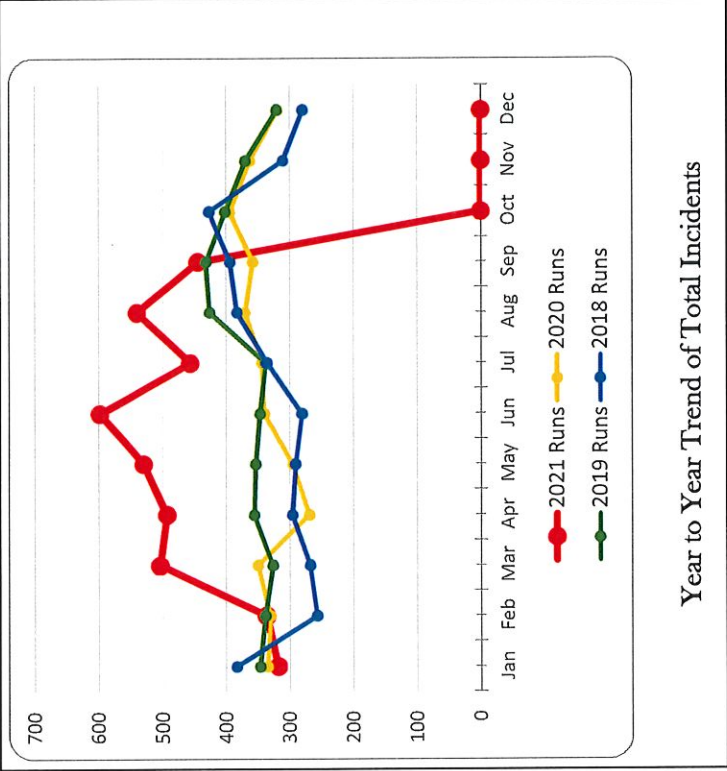

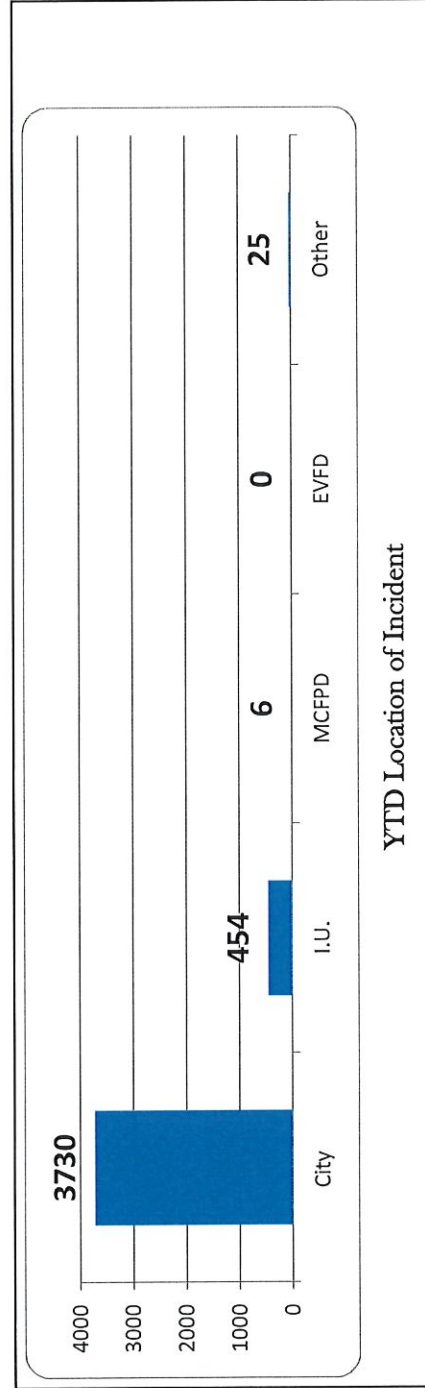
Operational Statistics



YTD Percentage of Incident Types

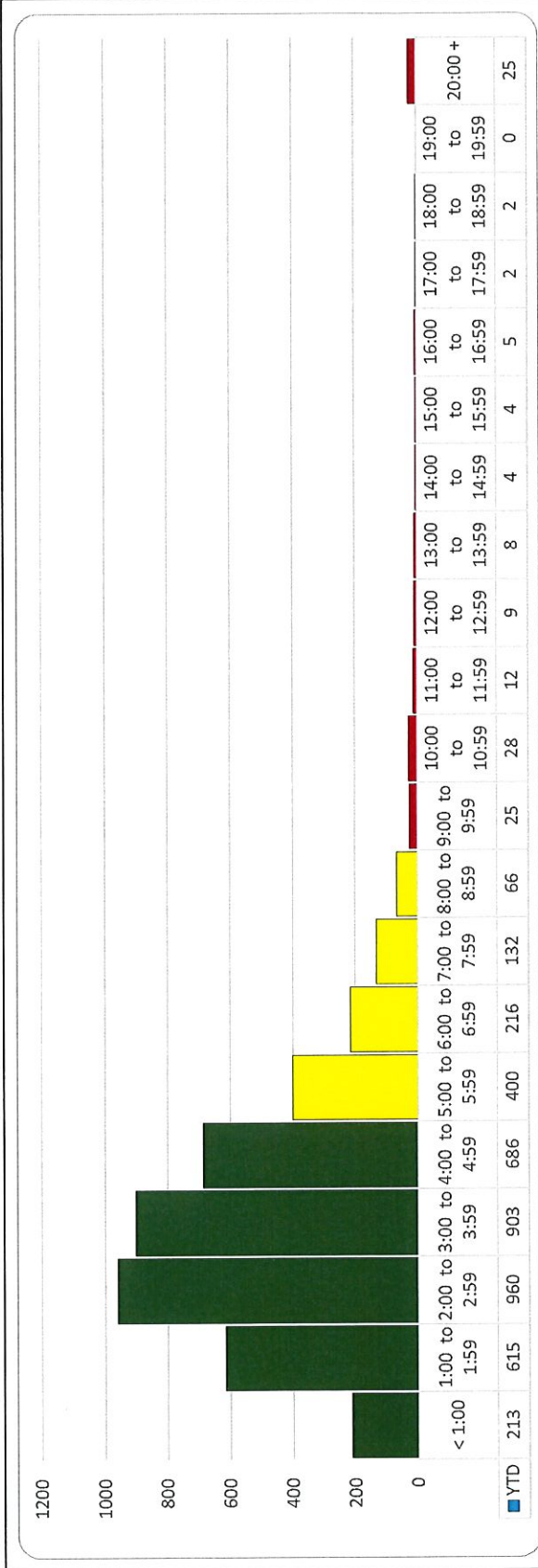


Year to Year Trend of Total Incidents

96% of our incidents within City Limits

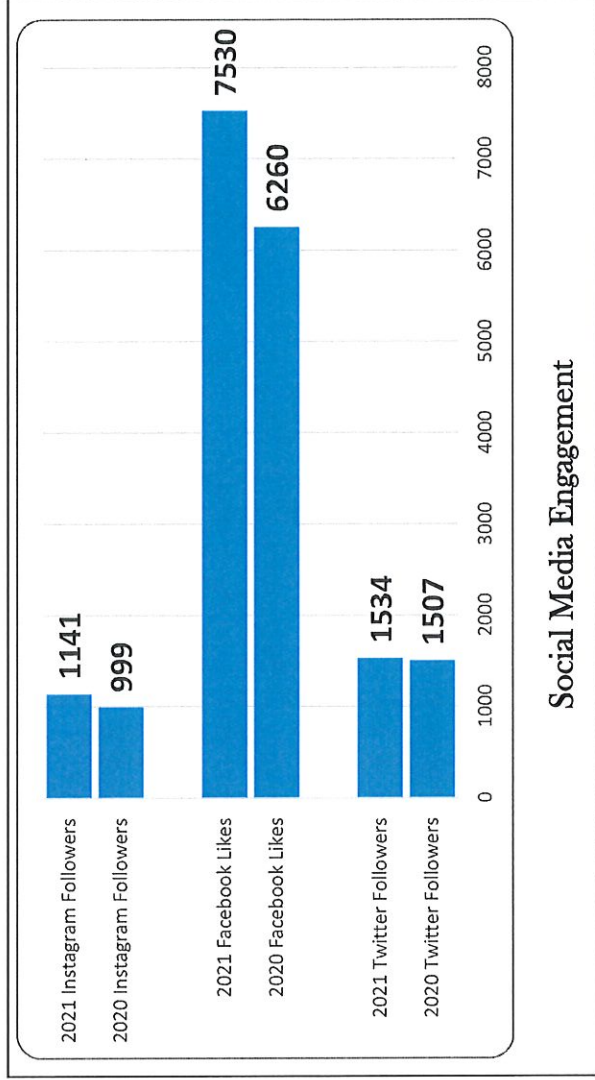
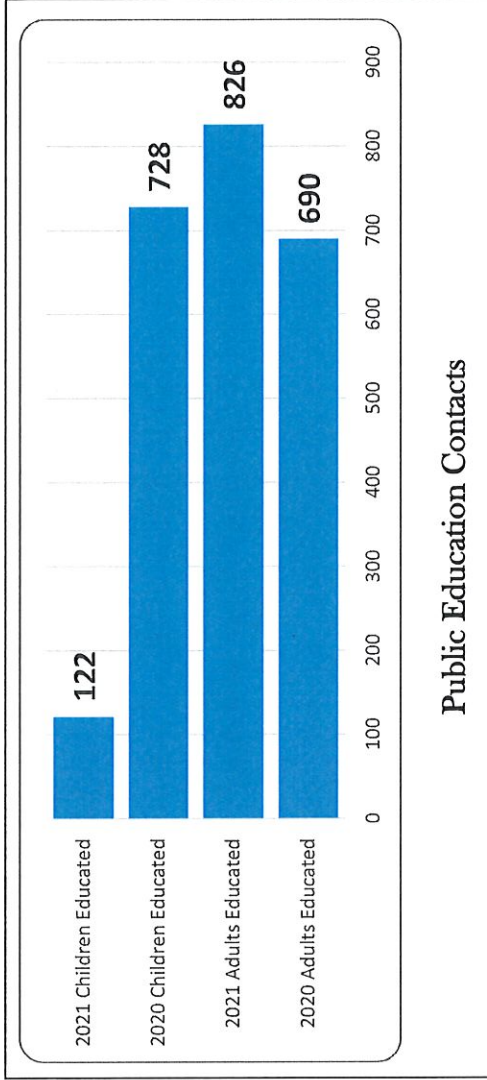
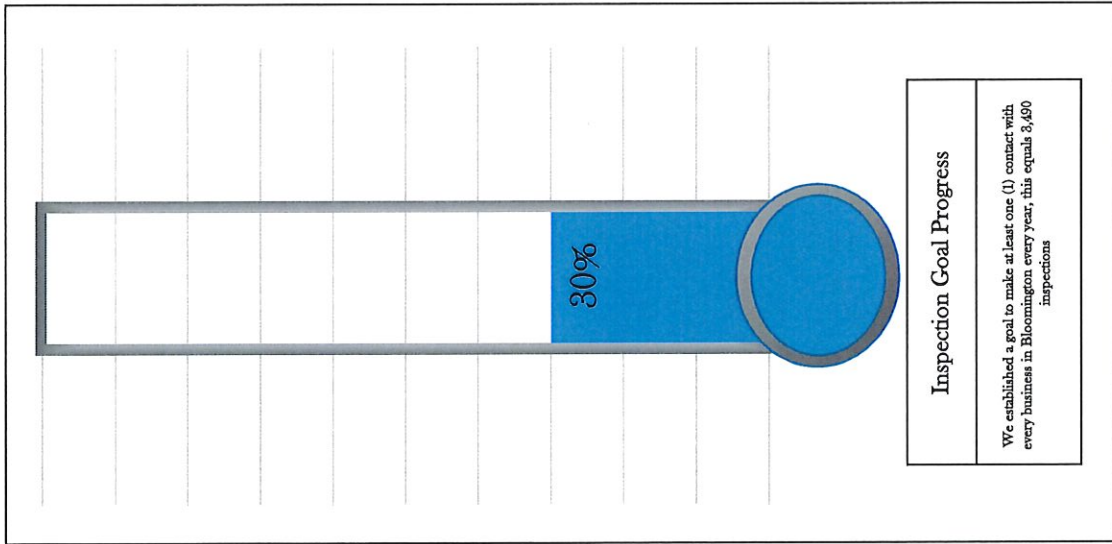
