### Appendix C

Additional Information on Actions to Reduce GHG Emissions for City Operations

To achieve a 12 percent reduction in GHG emissions from municipal buildings and operations by 2023, the City will need to reduce energy use in the sectors outlined below. To create a small buffer for achieving these goals, the City could strategically plant approximately 1,000 trees of a species with high capacity for CO2 absorption, create low-mow lawns, and restore native habitats on city properties with the intent to offset approximately 40 tons of CO2 emissions.
