


2020 Census - Have you completed yours?

Bloomington Health Foundation and CJAM Awarded National Grant

The Bloomington Health Foundation (BHF), in partnership with Community Justice and Mediation Center (CJAM), has \$600,000 received over through Community Voices for Health (CVH), an initiative led by Public Agenda and Altarum, with funding from the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation. The funding will support the Community Voices for Health in Monroe County. This is an Indiana project that works to build a stronger engagement infrastructure involving a broader range of people, especially marginalized and under served communities, so their voices are heard in healthcare policy-making decisions.
