- 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Thursday and Friday,
- 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. on Saturday.

### New draft Bloomington Zoning Map released for resident input

The City of Bloomington has published a draft of the proposed new Bloomington Zoning Map, as a step in the last phase of the process of updating the Unified Development Ordinance (UDO) and Zoning Map, which began nearly three years ago in February of 2018. Approved in April 2020, the UDO brings the City's land use and development laws into closer alignment with the City's 2018 Comprehensive Plan to support such goals as housing equity, compact urban form, and sustainability.

The <u>project website</u> contains the <u>public outreach draft map</u> and amendments to UDO standards, a proposed zoning changes story map, proposed housing diversity story map, an <u>interactive map</u> where residents may enter their address, and information about opportunities to provide feedback over the next eight weeks. The input collected during this period will help staff prepare for public hearings in early 2021 to consider and adopt the new zoning map for the city, along with text amendments.

The first public engagement session will take place via video conference from 5:30 p.m. to 7 p.m. on Tuesday, October 27. (A link to join the meeting will be posted at the project website.) The meeting will feature a presentation of the proposed changes with the largest impact with a short facilitated question-and-answer session after the presentation. There will be at least four meetings over the course of the next month to gather public input. Residents may also provide feedback through online surveys on the project website.

### **New COVID-19 testing site coming to Bloomington**

The City of Bloomington is partnering with the Monroe County Commissioners, Indiana University and IU Health to open a new COVID-19 testing site in downtown Bloomington. The site will be able to serve 200 or more community members per day. Free testing will be on an appointment basis, using an online registration system. This location will help support the need for public COVID-19 testing when the current OptumServe site at the National Guard Armory on South Walnut Street is decommissioned. The new site will be operational



until June 30, 2021. The city and IU will each supply \$100,000 in support of the facility and its operation; IU Health is providing in-kind contributions and physical space valued at around \$100,000; and the county government will contribute \$200,000 in dedicated grant funding from the Indiana State Department of Health as well as cover other operational costs, if required. The county has contracted with Medix to staff and operate the vaccination facility. The new site's location, hours of operation, appointment registration and more will be shared in the coming weeks.
