Rethinking autumn leaf management



An interdepartmental team of City of Bloomington staff have been exploring ways to rethink autumn leaf management. This fall, residents in Park Ridge and Spicewood neighborhoods will volunteer to participate in a pilot project to explore alternatives to vacuum leaf pick up. Determining what that pilot project will look like is a group effort, involving the City team and residents.

An initial public meeting was held to set the stage for this project. A second meeting to brainstorm ideas will be held on Tuesday, September 15 from 7:00 to 8:30 p.m. via Zoom. During its last monthly meeting, CONA approved changes to its bylaws. The new bylaws more clearly state the voting procedures, election procedures, terms of offices, and creates a standing education committee.

The elections for four positions on the CONA Executive Committee will be held during its next meeting on October 13. Nominations can be made up until the election. The City of Bloomington Bicycle and Pedestrian Safety Commission (BPSC) is seeking proposals from nonprofit organizations, locally owned businesses, and neighborhood associations that incorporate bicycle and pedestrian mobility into local events, programs, or other community activities. The Bloomington Urban Enterprise Association (BUEA) and the Bloomington Arts Commission (BAC) are seeking applications for a second round of funding to foster the arts and cultivate cultural experiences in Bloomington as part of Mayor John Hamilton's initiative to Recover Forward from the COVID-19 pandemic.

Completed applications are due Friday, October 2, at 5 p.m., with awards to be announced and distribution anticipated by late October.
