Leafing season is upon us



Please consider mulching or composting your leaves on-site. It's easier than you think, and much less work than raking or blowing the leaves to the street. Recycling leaves through these methods creates useful fertilizer for the yard and conserves

resources. The City has created a <u>brochure</u> and a <u>video</u> to share information about mulching and composting leaves.

Excess leaves that you are unable to recycle on-site may be placed in biodegradable paper sacks or City-approved yard waste bins for curbside collection at no charge from November 9 through December 24. You may also place excess leaves near the roadway for vacuum pickup.

<u>Curbside vacuum leaf pickup</u> begins today, Monday, November 9, and continues through Thursday, December 24. Each residence will receive one pickup.

For information about when to expect crews in your neighborhood, Visit the updated <u>interactive map</u>, and look for yard signs, which will be placed in your neighborhood a week ahead of its scheduled leaf pickup. Please rake leaves to the curb at the edge of your property, but avoid placing leaves in the roadway, sidewalk, around fire hydrants, or blocking drains.

Adopt-a-Drain

Adopt-a-Drain is a local volunteer program that provides the public with an opportunity to be actively involved in clearing storm drains. The program strives to improve the water quality of our streams while reducing flood risk.

Neighborhood Survey on Student Renters

- Encouraging placemaking among all neighborhood residents.
