Purple wintercreeper (*Euonymus fortunei*) is the MC-IRIS Reduce One Invasive Species Challenge species for 2021. If you control it on your land, you'll get a reward of native plants!*







Purple wintercreeper is an invasive vine that grows in many Monroe County yards and is invading forests in the county. Fortunately, it is easy to identify and there are a number of different ways to control it. **Be part of the solution** by joining together with MC-IRIS to control purple wintercreeper in 2021.

Why Should You Control Purple Wintercreeper?

- It makes a dense ground cover, displacing native plants and providing little food for native wildlife.
- Birds need 75% of the local plant base to be native to produce enough insect larvae to feed their offspring; purple wintercreeper endangers that food source.
- When Purple wintercreeper climbs it weakens the trees and starts to produce seeds that spread to more yards and to the forest.

Ready to control this invasive vine? Small areas can be pulled by hand, but it may take more to control large areas. Learn more on our website. *Also see this link for reward details.
