Residents 80 years and older are now eligible to receive a COVID-19 vaccine at no cost.

- **Vaccinations are by appointment only.** Please register either by calling 211 or visiting www.ourshot.in.gov.
- No walk-in vaccinations will be available,
- There are two locations available for vaccination. Seniors are encouraged to select the Convention Center as there are no hills or stairs to navigate, and complimentary parking is available.
- You will be asked to provide ID and proof of age when you arrive for your appointment.
