Help prevent flooding in your neighborhood

Due to heavy snowfall in recent weeks and the higher temperatures we are currently experiencing, snow melt has the potential to cause localized flooding.



You can help snow melt to more easily reach storm drains by clearing snow, ice accumulation, and other debris from storm drains in your neighborhood.

Winter is not the only time of year when drains can get blocked. Please consider volunteering for the <u>Adopt-a-Drain</u> program through the City of Bloomington Utilities department. The program would make for a great neighborhood project. As a group, you could commit to maintaining some or all of your neighborhood's portion of the 12,000 storm drains within City limits. Duties include:

- Inspecting storm drains at least once per month,
- Clearing storm drains when needed, and
- Completing and submitting Adopt-a-Drain Quarterly Reports.

4 water main breaks - Boil Water Advisory

City of Bloomington Utilities (CBU) crews were dispatched to complete emergency repairs on four water main breaks: 6th & Grant downtown, Allen & Lincoln in Bryan Park neighborhood, St James & Forrester in Hyde Park neighborhood, and Old State Road 37 & Fairfax. Motorists are advised to find alternate routes or adjust their speed accordingly when traveling near the work zone.

Water service was shut off for some addresses in those vicinities; those customers are now under a precautionary Boil Water Advisory. Unless otherwise notified, the precautionary Boil Water Advisory will be lifted 24 hours after water service is restored. As addresses are confirmed, they will be listed at bloomington.in.gov/utilities. Only those addresses that lost water service are under the precautionary Boil Water Advisory.


- Lifetime of Service (honoring an individual over age 60),

An additional category without a cash award will be available this year honoring a business operating locally in Monroe County for excellence in community engagement.

Regular sanitation schedules have resumed today

Since severe weather interfered with trash collection last week, **extra sealed bags of trash can be placed next to your carts at no extra charge**. Additional information about your schedule can be found <u>here</u>.

For curbside collection, please ensure that carts are away from any snow embankments, and follow these guidelines for trash and recycling pickup:



- Set carts near the street
- Point front of carts toward the street
- Set carts 4 feet apart, 4 feet away from other objects, and 10 feet away from vehicles
- Close lids completely
- Bag all solid waste
- Do NOT bag recyclable materials
