Brrrr! The cold weather is here.

Avoid frozen pipes by keeping a slow drip running from your faucets. This will also protect your water meter and the service line running into your home. You can collect this water to use for your pets, plants, or other uses, so it doesn't go to waste.





Don't forget to keep your walkways free of snow and ice. According to the <u>Bloomington</u> <u>Municipal Code</u>, you are responsible for clearing snow and ice from any sidewalk abutting your property. This must be completed within 24 hours after the snow or ice ceases to fall or accumulate.

Take control of the invasive plants on your land — borrow a tool kit today!



Monroe County Identify and Reduce Invasive Species (MC-IRIS) has created 8 tool kits to loan to Monroe County residents for invasive plant control. Monitor your home water usage with the CBU Customer Portal



As a City of Bloomington Utilities customer, the water service to your home is measured by a "smart meter". This modernized metering system allows for automated readings and enhances CBU's ability to respond to infrastructure issues. In addition, you can access detailed water usage information, allowing you to make informed decisions on how to manage your water consumption and alert you to potential leaks.

The <u>Customer Portal</u> allows you to monitor your water usage, set alarms, and diagnose potential problems in your plumbing systems, by seeing the hour by hour data as measured by your smart meter. More information about smart meters can be found <u>here</u>.
