Are you interested in buying your first home?

The <u>HAND Department's Home Buyers Club</u> program offers participants a chance to explore the possibility of affordable home ownership. The Home Buyers Club is comprised of two sessions which are held on two consecutive Saturdays. The first Saturday session is from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. and the second Saturday session is from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.



The goal of the class is to help first-time home buyers understand and overcome the obstacles involved in purchasing their first home, as well as what to expect after buying a home.

Participants will have the opportunity to meet one-on-one with a housing counselor to discuss any potential obstacles to achieving their goal. Income eligible graduates may qualify for up to \$10,000 in Down Payment Closing Cost Assistance from HAND.

Rental occupancy affidavit now in effect

On June 16, 2021 the Bloomington Common Council passed Ordinance 21-30, requiring landlords and tenants to sign an Occupancy Affidavit attesting to the maximum occupancy for the rental property. This ordinance only applies to rental properties with 4 or fewer units. The Affidavit must be executed each time there is a change in tenancy. It will not be sent to HAND, but rather must be maintained by the landlord and presented to HAND inspectors upon any HAND inspection. If found to be in violation of the Affidavit/Ordinance, the landlord and/or tenants may be fined up to \$500. The landlord and tenant information contained in the Affidavit is not subject to Public Records Requests.

Connecting Bloomington's greenspace - with your help



We live in exciting times. Why may you ask? The answer will show itself in the next few months, as the <u>Bloomington Environmental Commission</u> (EC) puts the finishing touches on the <u>Bloomington Habitat Connectivity Plan</u>. The plan seeks to strengthen biodiversity in our area and improve habitat connectivity between main areas of greenspace. As a private landowner, you can volunteer to sign a pledge to protect land on your property where native plants are growing or will be planted in the near future. Your pledge can entail land as small as a dinner plate. The amount of land you pledge is up to you.

The EC encourages as many people as possible to sign up for the habitat connectivity project. You can flaunt your native garden to fellow residents of Bloomington, and you can show how you are helping to connect existing greenspace by identifying the location of your native habitat on this <u>interactive map</u>.
