It's never too early to plan for your next neighborhood grant application

HAND neighborhood grant cycles are completed for 2021, but now is the time to start planning for the 2022 funding round. HAND offers three types of grants:

- Neighborhood Improvement Grants: for capital projects with a minimum budget of \$1,100 and a 10% match. Application deadline: March 21, 2022.
- Small & Simple Grants: maximum grant of \$500, no match component. Applications available from January 1 through September 1, 2022, or until funds are depleted.
 - traditional S&S grants for events, workshops, mailings, small projects, etc.
 - o dedicated S&S grants for neighborhood-wide invasive plant species removal.
- Neighborhood Cleanup Grants: a HAND-sponsored cleanup day for your neighborhood. Application deadline: March 7, 2022.

Neighborhood groups of all kinds are eligible to apply for HAND grants. One need not be a recognized neighborhood association. Detailed grant guidelines are available at the links above. 2022 grant applications will be available beginning January 1, 2022. Indiana Emergency Rental Assistance (IERA) portal is OPEN

TENANTS Are you behind on your rent and utility payments?

LANDLORDS Do you have tenants who are behind on their rent?



Eligible households can receive up to 12 months of assistance in past due and forward facing rent and utilities (electric, gas, water/wastewater, and bulk fuel). All of the following must apply to meet eligibility requirements:

- At least one household member has qualified for unemployment benefits or has experienced a reduction in income, incurred significant costs, or experienced a financial hardship *due to COVID-19*.
- At least one household member must demonstrate a risk of homelessness or housing instability.
- Household income must be at or below 80% of the Area Median Income (AMI).
- The property for which you are seeking assistance must be your primary residence.
