The City of Bloomington's Office of the City Clerk and the Office of the Mayor are accepting applications from community members who would like to serve on one of the City's boards or commissions. Some of these bodies are anticipating vacancies as current terms expire in December 2021 and January 2022.

- Redevelopment Commission, and others.

After applying, members must be appointed to each board or commission by the mayor, council, or another appointing body. Please note: city residency is required for membership on most but not all of the boards and commissions.

Water rates have increased as of January 1

New rates, as approved by the Utilities Service Board (USB), City Council, and Indiana Utilities Regulatory Commission (IURC), will increase funding to the water main replacement program and other drinking water improvements. Student Legal Services Helps IU Students with Housing Issues



IU Students living off campus have access to a university program that educates and advocates for them regarding their rights and responsibilities as tenants. Student Legal Services ("SLS") opened in the 1970s and is staffed by licensed attorneys who help students understand their leases, resolve disputes with landlords, and deal with other tenant issues. The service is free to IU Bloomington students and can help them save money and avoid headaches and frustration.

Information about SLS is available through their website at <u>getlegal.indiana.edu</u>, including tips for avoiding common problems associated with renting off campus. Their winterizing tips are definitely worth a look as temperatures dip this time of year. Neighbors of students are encouraged to tell them about the service, and students with a current problem can schedule an appointment through the website to discuss their situation and get help.
