


PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY

- Retail food establishments must be located in the Bloomington Entertainment and Arts District (Downtown Bloomington) to be eligible for this program.
- Businesses must also hold a valid Monroe County Health Department permanent retail food establishment license.
- Businesses must not be current EarthKeepers customer.

Mobile food vendors are not eligible for this program at this point in time.





The Bloomington Entertainment & Arts District:

• **Is a state designated cultural district** and city-led economic development project that supports the galleries, performing arts venues, public parks, hotels, and nearly 100 restaurants and more than 100 specialty shops spread across 60 city blocks in the heart of downtown.



PROGRAM INCENTIVE

Participating restaurant and retail food establishments in the program will receive the following during the three month trial:

- Weekly collection of hot-stamped rollers (32-gallons each) and delivery of sanitized replacement rollers. Rollers may
 be collected two or three times per week, depending on assessed needs
- 5-gallon buckets and 1.5-gallon pails, with lids, for internal use
- Waste audit
- Window decals for participant
- Personalized web-profile on the EarthKeepers website
- Mixed-media promotions of participating restaurants as EarthKeepers partners.

The program incentive is valued at \$5,000 per participating establishment.





WASTE AUDIT

In Person Site Visits

Audit Includes:

- Presentation and Q&A for owners and staff
- Staff training session
- Discussions with staff to identify common composting contaminants
- Custom signage and bin placement

Application Process and Timeline:

- March 1: Funding announcement and applications open
- March 7: Information Session

Cohort Dates and Application Deadlines:

- Cohort 1: April 2022 July 2022- applications due March 25th
- Cohort 2: June 2022 October 2022- applications due June 10th
- Cohort 3: September 2022 January 2022- applications due September 9th
- Cohort 4: January 2023 May 2023- applications due January 13, 2023
