

YOUR GUIDE TO PARKING IN BLOOMINGTON



NEIGHBORHOOD PARKING PERMITS



Did you know parking permits are required for residents that live in many neighborhoods in the downtown and campus-adjacent areas of Bloomington? To see if your address is eligible for a neighborhood parking permit, go to bloomington.in.gov/mybloomington and type in your address. Or you can visit bloomington.in.gov/parking and click on Neighborhood Parking Permit Zone Map.

If your address is eligible, you must request a parking permit through the City's parking portal. Go to bloomington.in.gov/parking and click on the gray box that states 'Neighborhood Parking Permits.'

Follow these three simple steps to apply for a neighborhood permit:

<u>Step 1</u>: Request/apply for a permit (upload required documents)

<u>Step 2</u>: Application/request will be approved or rejected and notification will be sent to the applicant's email

<u>Step 3</u>: An approval email will be sent with a link to purchase the permit.

RENTERS

The online application process requires the following:

- 1. Uploading your signed lease and
- 2. A valid (not expired) vehicle registration

HOMEOWNERS

The online application process requires the following:

- 1. A current utility bill or property tax statement
- 2. A valid (not expired) vehicle registration

PARKING HOURS

As stated in the Bloomington Municipal Code (BMC15.37.030), current hours of enforcement are as follows:

"All zones shall be in effect from eight a.m. to five p.m. Monday through Friday. Additionally, from August 15 through May 15, Zone 6 shall be in continuous effect from eight a.m. Thursday until eight a.m. Sunday."

Enforcement hours are subject to change. Always check times posted on parking signs wherever you park.

MONTHLY PARKING GARAGE PERMITS



Did you know the City has four parking garages? Here's where you can find them:

4th Street Garage – 105 W. 4th St. The entrance is located on 4th St. between Walnut St. and College Ave.

<u>Trades District Garage</u> – 489 W. 10th St. The entrance is located on 10th St. off Rogers St.

Morton Street Garage – 300 N. Morton St. The entrance is located on Morton St. between 6th St. and 7th St.

<u>Walnut Street Garage</u> – 302 N. Walnut St. The entrance is located on Walnut St. between 7th St. and 8th St.

Follow these three simple steps to get your garage pass:

<u>Step 1</u>: Download and complete the parking contract (scan the QR code above).

Step 2: Once you have filled out the parking contract, email it to COB_garages@bloomington.in.gov

Step 3: The applicant will be contacted via phone to provide automatic payment information, or they may elect to pay for their parking fee over the phone.
