STORM DRAIN MARKING PROGRAM

The Storm Drain Marking Program is a consolidated effort by the City of Bloomington Utilities and volunteers to help keep our stormwater clean. The program raises awareness of water pollution and limits the amount of contaminants that enter our waterways. Bloomington is home to two major watersheds and 99 miles of streams.

Storm drains are commonly misused for disposal of waste such as paint, motor oil, antifreeze, pesticides, yard and pet waste, and other pollutants. Improper disposal can seriously damage our community's stormwater quality and the environment since the stormwater that enters is not filtered and flows directly to our streams.

Polluted streams can lead to algal blooms, which can be hazardous to health.
