

## **City Policy on Yellow Groove Bamboo**

Yellow groove bamboo (*Phyllostachys aureosulcata*) is included on the list of prohibited invasive plant species under the Unified Development Ordinance, adopted into Bloomington Municipal Code (BMC) in 2020 by the City Council. Under Title 6 of the BMC, it is unlawful for the owner of any lot or tract of ground within the city to plant or maintain, at a height in excess of eight inches, any plant species that is prohibited under federal, state, or local regulations.

Following is the process by which the City of Bloomington is enforcing the prohibition against yellow groove bamboo:

- 1. Neighborhood compliance officers in the Department of Housing and Neighborhood Development (HAND) will issue a warning to property owners who have yellow groove bamboo growing on their property.
- 2. HAND will give property owners a 90-day grace period to work out a plan and begin the process of eradication and disposal.
- 3. After that 90 days, HAND neighborhood compliance officers will discuss the progress with the property owner and continue to monitor compliance with the removal plan.
- 4. HAND will not issue tickets with fines unless the property owner fails, or refuses, to follow through with the approved plan for removal of the bamboo.
- 5. If a property owner refuses to remove the bamboo from their property, HAND may move to have the property abated with consent of the Board of Public Works. The costs of abatement will be the responsibility of the property owner and will be collected as detailed in Bloomington Municipal Code (BMC) Title 6 (<u>https://bton.in/Fk5ho</u>).

The City will provide affected property owners with information on best practices for removal and disposal of bamboo, so they may develop a workable eradication plan.
