

- Recommend a community-led alternative public safety program based on the principles of poverty decriminalization, human dignity, racial equity, harm reduction and restorative justice.
- 2. Empower our community to have maximum control of program design, implementation and oversight.
- 3. Ensure sustainability of program through detailed recommendations for budgeting plans, institutional partners, staffing, and key performance indicators.









discussion points.

1. SMALL GROUP BREAKOUT (60 Mins)

Welcome and review priorities and group guidelines (see above). Ask for agreement. Address participation if "observers" are in attendance. (3 mins)

Prompt 1: Introductory Go-round (Personal stake). Say first name/pronouns if you choose (30 Mins total including theme review by facilitator)

 From your personal experience, how do you relate to the issue of public safety in Bloomington? How have you been affected, or you and your family been affected? Others you know?
 Repeat question

*NT gives three-minute sign to facilitator. Facilitator wraps up session in about a minute and then has 2 minutes to:

Note: If conversations from Prompt 2 are robust, and it seems that there are folks who are eager to continue sharing, you can take a pause, let them know they can choose to keep talking about Prompt 2. Read prompt 3 question and then get their agreement to either move on to next question, or continue exploring 2.



 - Facilitator reviews high level themes of Prompts 2 & 3. F can ask NT if missed anything and then participants.
- Facilitator thanks participants and reminds them that if they have more to share the reach out to the commission members to schedule a 1-1. Directs participants to go







Pre-event survey: Do you consider yourself a member of a marginalized


group?
