# Note from the CAPS Commission

The CAPS Commission was created by the Common Council of the City of Bloomington in November 2020 to amplify the voices of marginalized residents regarding public safety and to improve the safety of all residents. (Ordinance 20-20)

After completing extensive evidence-based research on alternatives to policing and conducting outreach with key stakeholders, **the Commission released an Alternative Public Safety Report**, entitled “**Safety For All, At the Expense of None,**” that recommends a Department of Community Safety & Resilience (DCSR) to meet the safety needs of our community in a human-centered and non-coercive way.
