The application deadline is March 3, so now is the time to organize your neighbors and get your application together.

- there is broad neighborhood support for holding a cleanup,
- your neighborhood is organized and committed to a successful cleanup,
- volunteers have pledged to working specific hours during the cleanup, and
- · communication within the neighborhood is ongoing.




# Cars speeding through your neighborhood?


# Grab a shovel, help out a neighbor!

The City of Bloomington is seeking volunteers for the <u>Snow Buddies Program</u>, an initiative designed to assist residents who are unable to clear snow from sidewalks and walkways due to disability or age. The program, organized by the <u>Council for Community Accessibility (CCA)</u>, connects volunteers with residents who need help maintaining safe and accessible pathways during winter.

Snowy and icy sidewalks are a safety hazard for all pedestrians, so please do your part to clear the sidewalks adjacent to your property. City ordinance states that property owners are responsible for clearing these areas within twenty-four hours after snow or ice has ceased to fall.

We need your help to keep everyone moving safely. Thank you!






# Looking for something fun to do?
