

Resources for challenges with our unhoused neighbors: Who should I call and when?

For emergencies that require an immediate police response, e.g., <u>fights, disturbances, weapons, trespass, medical</u>
emergencies, call 911. These are calls that are in progress.

- For non-emergency situations requiring a patrol response, usually non-violent calls or calls not in progress, call 812-339-4477 and ask for a patrol officer response.
- For non-emergency calls requesting a Downtown Resource Officer (DRO), specifically to report an unhoused person's complaint or request, please call 812-339-4477 and ask for a DRO response to the scene. If one is not available, they will send a patrol; however, you can request a DRO or no response. We also have an email address that is sent to all DROs (police-dro@bloomington.in.gov).

If you would like to leave a message for the DRO Supervisor, please call 812-349-3952; however, a response may be delayed. Email is preferred: fabrism@bloomington.in.gov.

Needle Pick-up & Disposal:

If you have found an improperly disposed of syringe in a public space in Monroe County, please call (812) 349-2543 to leave a message with your name, phone number, and the specific location of the syringe. Staff will respond during regular business hours.
