Transportation Commission

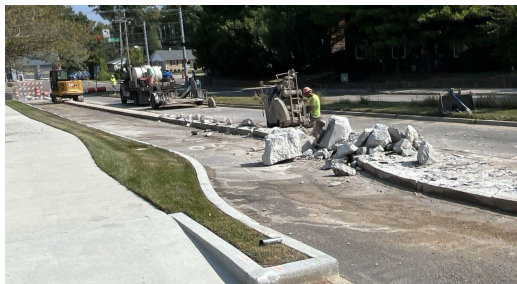
- **Established February 2025**

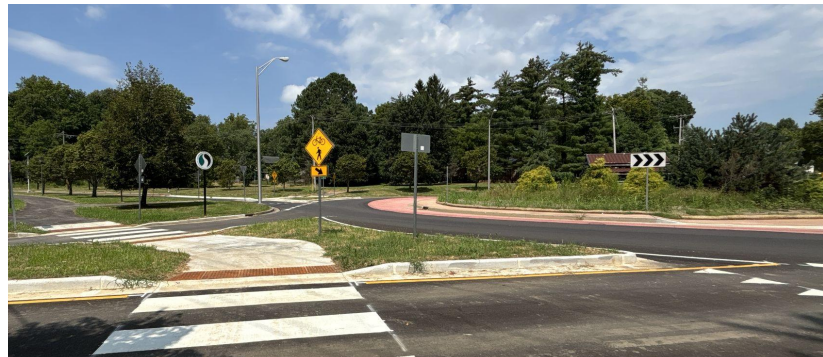

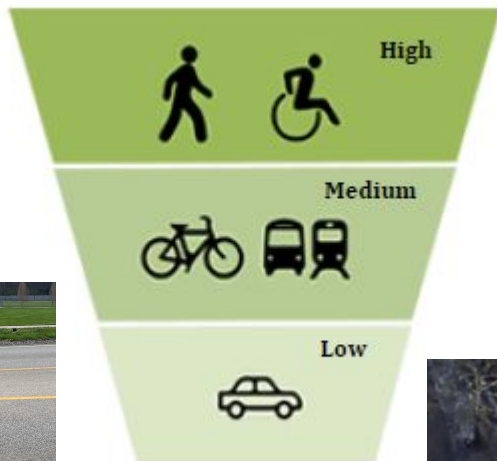
