Safe Crossing Checklist

Before crossing a street, a pedestrian should:

1. Stop at the edge of the street
2. Look left, right, and left again
3. Watch for turning vehicles
4. Check for vehicles that may be turning
5. Wait for a safe gap or crossing signal

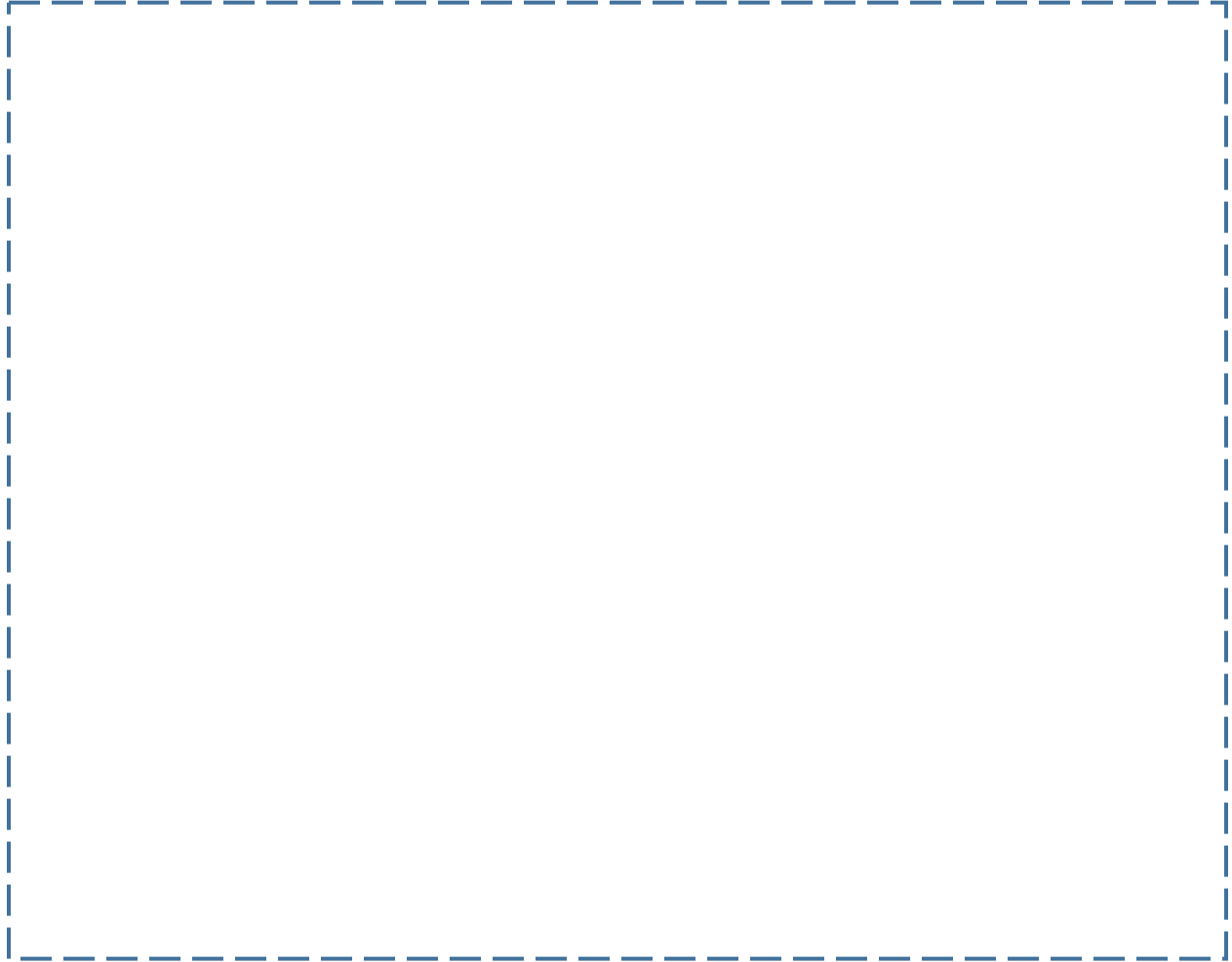
In the box below, sketch the intersection and label:

- The place where you would wait before crossing

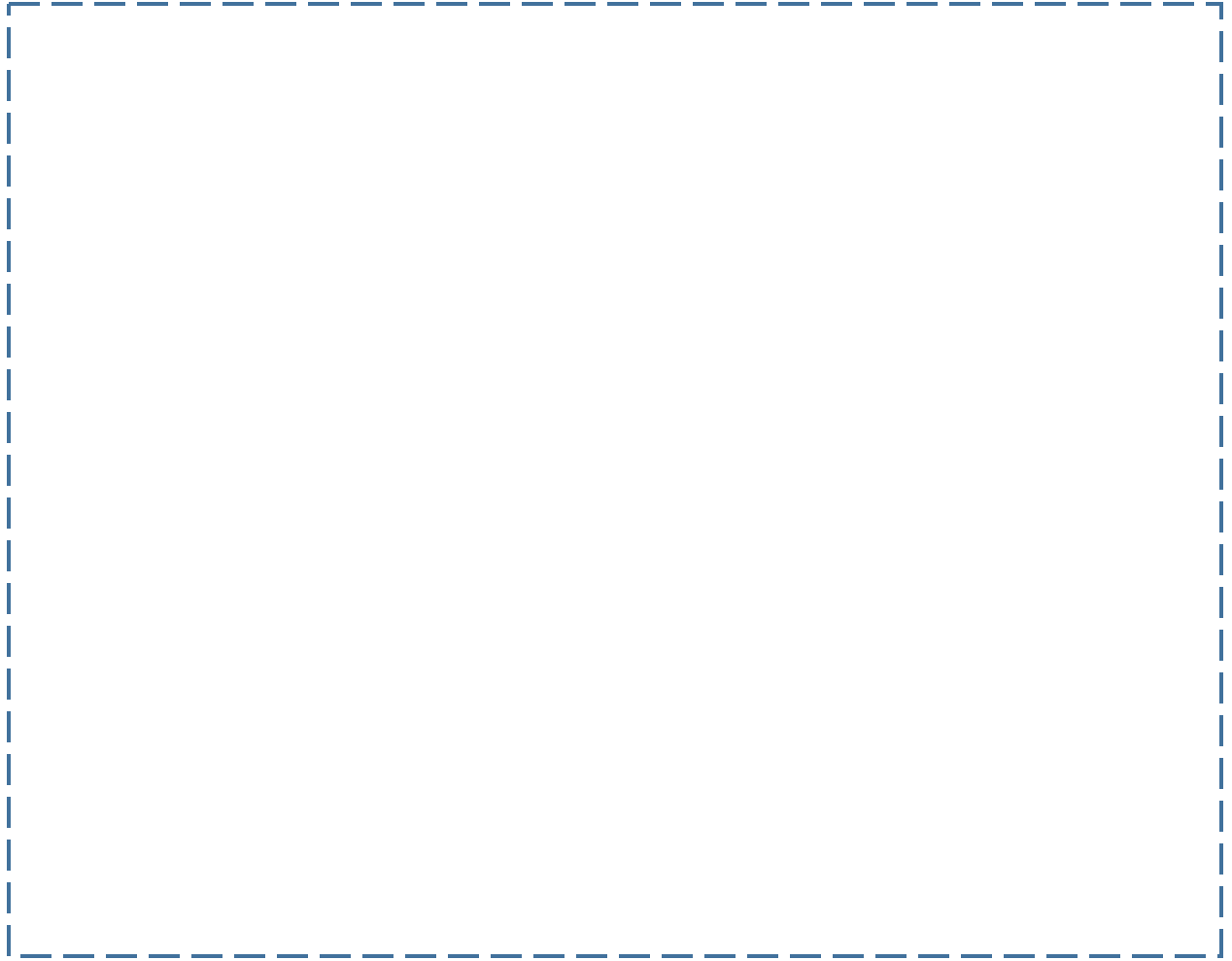
